STAFF'S SUPPLEMENTAL ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS RECOMMENDATION

COMES NOW the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and files this Staff's Supplemental Administrative Completeness Recommendation in response to Order No. 4 and would show the following:

I. BACKGROUND

On December 31, 2015, the City of Gregory (Gregory) filed an application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) to obtain new water and sewer certificates of convenience and necessity (CCN) in San Patricio County, Texas. Gregory seeks to acquire CCNs for the area within its extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ).

On May 11, 2016, Order No. 4 was issued finding the application administratively incomplete and establishing a deadline of July 8, 2016 for Staff to file additional comments regarding the administrative completeness of the application, along with a proposed procedural schedule if deemed administratively complete. This pleading is therefore timely filed.

II. **RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS**

Staff has reviewed Gregory's application along with the supplemental information filed on March 29, 2016, May 16, 2016, and June 28, 2016 and, as detailed in the attached memorandum from Sean Scaff, Gary Horton, and Tracy Montes in the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division, Staff recommends that the application be found administratively complete and accepted for filing. Staff therefore recommends that Gregory be ordered to provide notice as detailed in the attached memorandum.

More specifically, Staff recommends that Gregory be directed to provide correct notice of the application to the following:

a) any districts, utilities, and cities within five (5) miles of the proposed service area;

- b) the county judge of each county and each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partly included in the proposed area to be certified;
- c) each city with an extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ) that is wholly or partly included in the proposed area to be certified; and
- d) landowners who own a tract of land that is at least 25 acres and is wholly or partly located in the proposed area to be certified.

Staff also recommends that Gregory be directed to publish notice once each week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in San Patricio County and that Gregory be directed to include copy of a map showing the proposed service area with the individual notices to neighboring utilities, other affected parties, and each landowner.

III. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Staff recommends the application be found administratively complete. Staff therefore proposes the following procedural schedule:

Deadline for Staff to file a recommendation on sufficiency of notice	Within 10 days of Applicant filing proof of completed notice with the Commission
Deadline to intervene	30 days after notice is issued

IV. CONCLUSION

For the reasons stated above, Staff respectfully recommends that Gregory's application be found administratively complete and that Gregory be ordered to provide notice as detailed above and in the attached memorandum. On December 31, 2015, the City of Gregory (Gregory) filed with the Public Utility Commission (Commission) an application to obtain water and sewer Certificates of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) in San Patricio County, Texas. Gregory currently serves customers in the city but purchases water from San Patricio Municipal Water District. Gregory seeks to acquire CCNs for the area within their city limits and extraterritorial jurisdiction.

Based on Staff's review of the above referenced application and supplemental filings on June 28, 2016, Staff recommends that the application be deemed sufficient for filing. Staff further recommends the following:

- 1) The Applicant be ordered to provide correct notice of the application to the following:
 - a) any districts, utilities, and cities within five (5) miles of the proposed service area;
 - b) the county judge of each county and each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partly included in the proposed area to be certified;
 - c) each city with an extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ) that is wholly or partly included in the proposed area to be certified;
 - d) landowners who own a tract of land that is at least 25 acres and is wholly or partly located in the proposed area to be certified. The landowner information may be obtained from the county appraisal district tax rolls for the county or counties in which the proposed CCN is located; and
 - e) publish notice once each week for two (2) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in San Patricio County.
- 2) The Applicant should provide correct notice of the application to the following entities:
 - City of Aransas Pass (CCN 11181 and CCN 20456)
 - City of Corpus Christi
 - City of Ingleside (CCN 10562 and CCN 20202)
 - City of Portland (CCN 10541 and CCN 20216)
 - Nueces River Authority
 - Port of Corpus Christi Authority
 - Rincon WSC (CCN 11440)
 - San Patricio County
 - San Patricio Groundwater Conservation District
 - San Patricio County Drainage District

- San Patricio County Navigation District 1
- San Patricio MWD
- 3) The Applicant be ordered to include copy of a map showing the proposed service area with the individual notices to neighboring utilities, other affected parties and each landowner. It is the Applicant's burden to provide an accurate map delineating the proposed area with each individual notice. Information related to districts including addresses can be obtained from the TCEQ's web site located at <u>http://www14.tceq.texas.gov/iwud/</u>. and
- 4) The Applicant file within 30 days of the Commission order, a copy of the actual notice and map issued, along with signed affidavits indicating that the notice was given. It is recommended that the Applicant use the attached notices and affidavits to meet these requirements.

Additional items to be addressed during the technical review phase:

 The Applicant must provide documentation signed by the following district(s) allowing the Applicant to provide retail (water and/or sewer) service(s) within the district's boundaries:

 a. San Patricio MWD

If a public hearing is requested, the Commission will not issue the CCN and will forward the application to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH) for a hearing. If no settlement is reached and an evidentiary hearing is held, the SOAH will submit a recommendation to the Commission for final decision. If an evidentiary hearing is held, it will be a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.

If you are a landowner with a tract of land at least 25 acres or more, that is partially or wholly located within the proposed area, you may request to be excluded from the proposed area (or "opt out") by providing written notice to the Commission within (30) days from the date that notice was provided by the applicant. All requests to opt out of the requested service area must include a large scale map and a metes and bounds description of the tract of land.
