My name is Michael Sugrue and I live at 110 Carmel Place Mabank, Texas 75156.

Monarch/Southwest Water Company supplies our water and overall the service is somewhat acceptable. The exceptions to this are the water rates are very high by comparison making irrigation a very expensive proposition.

The quality of the water is somewhat suspect, since we must change our water filters more frequently than anticipated.

The low water pressure that we experience is exacerbated when the pressure drops even further as it does occasionally.

When a problem occurs, the service by Southwest Water Company is relatively quick and the problem is rectified. However, if the soil or street is disturbed, the soil is roughly re-graded and the street is never repaired. Multiple calls go without results. Eventually the community pays to ' have the soil or the road repaired.
