Purpose: Intervention request in the construction of a proposed double circuit, 345-KV transmission line that will begin at a new Oncor Electric Delivery Company switching station(s) in Rusk and Panola Counties. Texas.

Major Concerns:

- ☐ If PUC Docket 45624 moves forward with the proposed construction of the transmission line, I expect to be compensated for damages to the land itself, equipment on the land, right of way, natural gas lines and timber. This also includes, but is not limited to any other factors that negatively impact the land directly/indirectly with respect to the construction of the transmission line.
