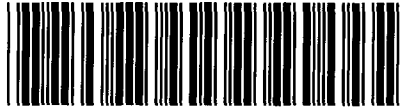

Homeowner affected by Routes B4 and B4a

As Vice-President, Oak Creek Homeowner's Association, on behalf of homeowners affected by Routes B4 and B4a, as well as all Association homeowners who are owners of the clubhouse, pool and children's playground affected by Routes B4 and B4a. Route F4 affects homeowners on Robin and impacts the Brushy Creek Trail extension into downtown Round Rock

I am writing to comment on Routes B4 and B4a, which affect me individually as a property owner (2408 Falcon Drive). I also write on behalf of the Oak Creek Homeowner's Association (OCHOA) and its impacted property owners (residents of homes on Cardinal, Starling, Falcon, Canary, Hummingbird, Oakwood, Bobwhite, Parrot and Robin) and the entire OCHOA membership with an ownership in the OCHOA clubhouse, pool, children's playground and parking lot located at 1203 and 1207 Oaklands Drive, Round Rock, TX 78681. I have previously filed as an intervenor individually. I also filed as an intervenor on behalf of OCHOA and its Board of Directors as Vice-President of the Homeowner's Association, representing the Board of Directors and our OCHOA member households.

Route B4

This route is entirely inappropriate as a route selection because it passes too close to our HOA pool, clubhouse and children's playground and cannot be safely constructed in the area indicated on LCRA maps. It would cross environmentally sensitive land containing karst and wildlife.

Route B4a

While this route is closer to the new Creek Bend extension, it remains very close to HOA property and crosses environmentally sensitive land containing wildlife, karst, and Brushy Creek.


Route F4

This route also crosses environmentally sensitive land containing karst, wildlife and Brushy Creek and would be adjacent to the Brushy Creek Trail extension.

Georgetown) have made their feelings clear about locating power lines adjacent to Brushy Creek Trail and the proposed extension of the trail. The LCRA acknowledges those concerns and the environmental considerations and has removed Routes N3 and A4 from its route recommendations. The Commissioners should abide by the LCRA recommendation to route the power lines in the path that is least destructive to the environment and homeowners. Without routes N3 and A4, there is no reason at all to consider routes B4, B4a, or F4.
