Request to Intervene in PUC Docket No. 45866

Headlines You Don't Want to Read:

Approximately 16 years ago, as President of the Vista Oaks Neighborhood Association, my neighbors and I fought for many months to get a signal light installed at the entry of the subdivision (Vista Hills Dr. and 1431). Unfortunately we were met with much opposition, involving cost, until a fatality occurred. I only mention this incident as a way of reminding us of what we are preparing to do with the installation of 80ft. powerlines and what we may need to rethink:

1. Safety for Vista Oaks kids - Powerlines hanging over Church nursery/Daycare Center, Vista Oaks Pool and recreation area can create a recipe for headlines you don't want to read.
2. Safety for Vista Oaks residential drivers - 80 ft. powerlines hanging over "other lower powerlines", + semi-trucks constantly traveling to and from the quarry + 65 mph traffic on 1431, can create a recipe for headlines you don't want to read.
3. Safety for homes in Vista Oaks - Since 1431 (from 183 to I-35) is known as tornado alley, additional powerlines may increase electrical fires and headlines you don't want to read.
