**ORDER NO. 3
DEEMING APPLICATION COMPLETE AND SUFFICIENT;
ESTABLISHING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE**

This Order addresses the administrative completeness of the City of Princeton's application to obtain a certificate of convenience and necessity in Collin County.

I. Commission Staff Recommendation on Administrative Completeness

On August 4, 2015, Commission Staff recommended that the application be found administratively complete, accepted for filing, and proposed a procedural schedule. Consistent with Commission Staff's recommendation, the application is deemed administratively complete.

II. Commission Staff Recommendation on Notice

Commission Staff has reviewed Princeton's proposed notice with regard to applicable statutes and rules and recommended that Princeton provide notice and submit signed affidavits indicating that notice was given, along with a copy of the actual notices issued. Accordingly, Princeton shall provide notice as recommended by Commission Staff and using the form attached to the recommendation.

III. Procedural Schedule

The following procedural schedule as proposed by Commission Staff is adopted:

Event	Date
Deadline for Princeton to file with the Commission signed affidavits evidencing that notice was given, along with a copy of the notice sent to the affected parties and published in a newspaper of general circulation	September 19, 2016

Deadline for Commission Staff to file a recommendation regarding the sufficiency of the notice provided	Within 10 days of applicant filing proof of completed notice with the Commission
Deadline to intervene	30 days after mailed or published notice, whichever occurs later
