SOAH ORDER NO. 5 SETTING DEADLINE FOR RESPONDING TO MOTION FOR SUMMARY DECISION

On March 14, 2017, the City Of Schertz (Schertz) filed a motion for partial summary decision of this case, in accordance with 16 Texas Administrative Code § 22.182(a). Schertz seeks summary decision as to the following referred issues:

- 8. What property, if any, will be rendered useless or valueless to Green Valley by the decertification sought by Schertz in this proceeding?
- 9. What property of Green Valley, if any, has Schertz requested to be transferred to it?

Responses to the motion are due by the date set by the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ).¹ The hearing on the merits is set to begin at 9:00 a.m., on March 28, 2017. The deadline for parties to respond to the motion for summary decision is March 23, 2017.

In ruling on the motion, the ALJ will consider all of the direct and rebuttal evidence prefiled by all parties, to which the ALJ has overruled all objections.² Parties need not attach any prefiled evidence to their responses.

The ALJ would note that Schertz has repeatedly asserted in pleadings and prefiled evidence that it has not requested Green Valley Special Utility District (GVSUD) to transfer any property to it. Thus, summary decision of Issue 9, at a minimum, appears appropriate.
