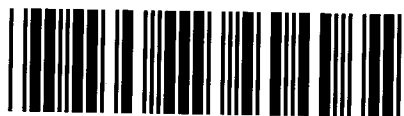

ORDER NO. 2
FINDING APPLICATION INCOMPLETE AND DEFICIENT,
ESTABLISHING DEADLINES AND OPPORTUNITY TO CURE

This Order addresses Commission Staff's recommendation that the Town of Providence Village's application is deficient. Commission Staff recommended that the application is not administratively complete because it contains material deficiencies, as specifically described in Commission Staff's June 13, 2016 pleading. Additionally, Commission Staff stated that Providence Village should be required to provide a copy of the decertification agreement between Mustang and Providence Village.


Consistent with Commission Staff's recommendation Providence Village's application is found administratively incomplete and deficient. Pursuant to 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 24.8(a), applications are not considered filed until a determination of administrative completeness is made; thus, at this time the application is not considered filed with the Commission.

On or before **July 13, 2016**, Providence Village shall amend its application to cure the deficiencies noted by Commission Staff. In addition, Providence Village shall provide a copy of the decertification agreement between Mustang and Providence Village. Processing of the application cannot proceed until the requested items are received and reviewed.

On or before **July 29, 2016** Commission Staff shall file additional comments regarding administrative completeness, along with a proposed procedural schedule if appropriate.
