COMMISSION STAFF'S SECOND RECOMMENDATION ON SUFFICIENCY

COMES NOW the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and files this Commission Staff's Second Recommendation on Sufficiency. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

I. BACKGROUND

On June 20, 2016, Monterrey Oaks, LTD (Monterrey Oaks) filed a petition for expedited release from the City of Splendora's (Splendora) water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) No. 111727 in Montgomery County, Texas.

In Order No. 2, issued July 17, 2016, the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) found the petition administratively incomplete and ordered Monterrey Oaks to file a notarized affidavit stating that the subject property is not receiving water service by August 19, 2016. Order No. 2 also ordered Staff to file a supplemental recommendation by September 19, 2016. Monterrey Oaks filed a notarized affidavit on July 25, 2016. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

II. RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

Staff has reviewed Monterrey Oaks' petition, as amended by the notarized affidavit, and as supported by the attached memorandum of Janie Kohl and Kristy Nguyen of the Water Utilities Division, Staff recommends that the amended petition is administratively complete. The notarized affidavit provided by Monterrey Oaks provides adequate information for Staff to continue its review of the petition to make a recommendation on whether it satisfies the requirements of TWC § 13.254(a-5) and 16 TAC § 24.113(r).

III. PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Staff proposes the following procedural schedule:

Staff respectfully requests the entry of an order finding Monterrey Oaks' petition administratively complete, and adopting Staff's proposed procedural schedule.

Expedited Release

On June 20, 2016, Monterrey Oaks, Ltd (Petitioner) filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) a petition for expedited release from the City of Splendora's (Splendora) water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 11727 in Montgomery County. This petition is being reviewed under Tex. Water Code § 13.254 (a-5) (TWC) and 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 24.113(r) (TAC). Petitioner asserts that the land is at least 25 acres, is not receiving water or sewer service, and is located in Montgomery County, which is a qualifying county.

On July 25, 2016, the Petitioner provide a notarized affidavit signed by the landowner, stating that the subject property has never received water service from Splendora as evidence in support of the petition. Therefore, Staff recommends the petition be deemed sufficient and accepted for filing.
