



## Agreement between Buyer and Seller

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#### MODIFICATION OF AGREEMENT FOR THE PURCHASE AND SALE OF WATER BETWEEN THE CITY OF HEARNE AND BETHANY-HEARNE WATER SUPPLY CORPORATION

STATE OF TEXAS
COUNTY OF ROBERTSON



Whereas, on December 12, 1966, the City of Hearne, hereinafter referred to as 'The City' and Bethany-Hearne Water Supply Corporation hereinafter referred to as 'The Corporation' entered into a buy sale agreement for the sale and purchase of fresh water and;

Whereas, the City and the Corporation desire to modify the terms of the agreement and,

Whereas, the City and the Corporation agree that the effective date of the new terms set forth

herein shall become effective January 1, 2008;

#### THEREFORE KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS AS FOLLOWS:

#### 1. EFFECTIVE DATE

The City and The Corporation mutually agree that the effective date of this modification shall be January 1, 2009.

#### 2. TERMS

The City and The Corporation mutually agree that effective January 1, 2008, that the term of the sale and purchase agreement shall be for one year at a time. The parties hereto mutually agree that unless otherwise terminated, in writing, by a party that this agreement shall automatically renew each 1<sup>st</sup> day of January of each year until terminated.

It is agreed by and between the parties hereto that either party may terminate the agreement upon 30 days written notice to the other party.

Modification of Agreement City of Hearne and Bethany-Hearne Water Supply Corp.

#### 3. Rates

The City and The Corporation mutually agree for and in consideration of the mutual covenants ascertained in the agreement that effective January 1, 2008, that the Corporation shall pay to the City the rate of \$1.50 per 1,000 (one thousand) gallons of water.

The City and the Corporation further agree that effective January 1, 2009, and for each year thereafter during the term of the agreement the rate the Corporation shall pay to The City per 1,000 gallons of water shall be adjusted to a price equal to the consumer price index for such commodities. Furthermore, the Corporation shall be notified of the adjusted rate by The City no later than December 1, 2008, and on or before the 1<sup>st</sup> day of December of each year thereafter during the term of this agreement.

#### 4. Remaining Provisions

The parties hereto mutually agree that unless otherwise altered by this modification agreement the remaining terms of the original sale purchase agreement dated December 12, 1966 shall remain in full force and effect.

#### 5. Assignment

The parties hereto mutually agree that this agreement is not assignable to any third party without the mutual consent of both The City and The Corporation.

#### 6. Severability

The parties hereto mutually agree that should any part of this agreement be held by the District Court of Robertson County, Texas to be unenforceable, the remaining provisions herein shall remain in full force and effect.

In Witness Whereof, the parties hereto, acting under the authority of their respective governing bodies have caused this agreement and contract to be duly executed.

#### **Investigation Comments:**

#### INTRODUCTION:

On December 4, 2014, Ms. Carla Garcia, Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) Region 9 Environmental Investigator contacted Public Works Director, Mr. Terry Thomas to schedule a comprehensive compliance investigation (CCI) at the City of Hearne public water supply. At that time, Mr. Thomas was informed of the purpose of the investigation.

On December 18, 2014, and January 29, 2015 an announced CCI was conducted at the regulated entity. The investigation was conducted with Mr. Thomas. TCEQ Investigators Ms. Carla Garcia and Ms. Jade Mendiola conducted the investigation. During an exit interview, all violations noted during the investigation were discussed with Mr. Thomas and Mr. Owens. Mr. Thomas and Mr. Owens were advised of the optional 14 day Area of Concern policy and were informed that a Notice of Violation (NOV) letter will be sent to the regulated entity.

#### GENERAL FACILITY AND PROCESS INFORMATION:

The City of Hearne public water supply is a community water supply that consists of five plants. The well at Well Site No. 2, (G1980004B) discharges into a single ground storage tank. Gas chlorine is injected prior to storage. Two service pumps take suction from the storage tank and pump to the distribution system as well as the Humble Addition plant. At Well Wite No. 3, one well (G1980004C) discharges directly into the distribution system. Gas chlorine is injected at this site. At well site No. 4, one well discharges directly into the distribution system. Gas chlorine is injected at this site. At well site No. 5, one well (G1980004E) discharges into three interconnected ground storage tanks. Gas chlorine is injected prior to storage. Two service pumps take suction from the three storage tanks and pump to the distribution system. A single elevated tank is provided for pressure maintenance.

During the January 29, 2015 CCI, it was noted that the City of Hearne and the City of Hearne Humble Addition, (former PWS No.1980008) have merged into one water system; City of Hearne public water supply. The service pumps from the City of Hearne Well Site No.2 pump to the interconnected ground storage tanks at the Humble Addition plant. Two service pumps take suction from the interconnected ground storage tanks to the pressure tank that supplies water to a separate pressure plane which serves 171 connections of the total water system.

#### Exceptions and Alternative Capacity Requirements:

1. By TCEQ letter dated May 24, 2006, the City of Hearne was granted an exception to 30 TAC 290.41(c)(3)(B), relating to minimum well casing height requirements. The letter grants an exception to the minimum well casing height requirement for well No. 4 (G1980004D). The letter indicates the exception is temporary and will expire the next time down hole work is conducted on the well. At that time the well casing must be extended to meet the minimum height requirement.

It was noted during a December 29, 2011, investigation that the casing for well No. 4 has been extended to meet the minimum well casing height requirement.

2. There are no alternative capacity requirements (ACRs) granted to the City of Hearne.

#### BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

On December 29, 2011, an announced CCI was conducted at the regulated entity. As a result, a General Compliance letter, dated January 29, 2012, was sent. The following alleged violations were noted during the CCI:

1. Failure to provide a water system record that needed to be reviewed at the time of the investigation. 2. Failure to verify the accuracy of the disinfectant residual analyzer.

- 3. Failure to monitor the disinfectant residual at representative locations in the distribution system at least once per day.
- 4. Failure to collect routine distribution coliform samples at active service connections.
- 5. Failure to properly screen the air release device.
- 6. Failure to provide a well casing vent.
- 7. Failure to house gas chlorination equipment and cylinders of chlorine in separate buildings or separate rooms separating all mechanical and electrical equipment from the chlorine facilities.
- 8. Failure to provide forced air ventilation for all enclosures containing more than one operating 150-pound cylinder of chlorine.

All noncompliances noted during the investigation were corrected within 14 days of the investigation and were resolved as Areas of Concern.

#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

All water treatment units, storage and pressure maintenance facilities were observed. Additionally, the disinfectant residual and water pressure were measured within each pressure plane of distribution system.

During the investigation, Mr. Thomas reported that the City of Hearne serves approximately 2,123 active connections. All capacity requirements were evaluated using the reported number of active connections.

Failure to maintain an intruder-resistant fence.

A fence six feet or greater in height, constructed of wood, concrete, masonry, or metal with three strands of barbed wire extending outward from the top of the fence at a 45 degree angle with the smooth side of the fence on the outside wall. In lieu of the barbed wire, the fence must be eight feet in height. The fence must be in good repair and close enough to surface grade to prevent intruder passage. All completed well units shall be protected by intruder-resistant fences, the gates of which are provided with locks or shall be enclosed in locked, ventilated well houses to exclude possible contamination or damage to the facilities by trespassers. The gates or wellhouses shall be locked during periods of darkness and when the plant is unattended. All potable water storage tanks and pressure maintenance facilities must be installed in a lockable building that is designed to prevent intruder access or enclosed by an intruder-resistant fence with lockable gates. Pedestal-type elevated storage tanks with lockable doors and without external ladders are exempt from this requirement. The gates and doors must be kept locked whenever the facility is unattended.

During the January 29, 2015 investigation, it was noted that the fence at the Humble Addition plant and the Well No. 3 plant are not maintained at least 6 feet in height.

At the Humble Addition plant the following sections were not measured to be at least 6 feet in height: 1.) A section located on the front panel was measured to be approximately 5 feet and 4 inches in height. 2.) A second

section located on the left panel of the fence was measured to be approximately 4 feet and 11 inches in height. 3.) A third section located on the back panel was measured to be approximately 5 feet and 8 inches in height. 4.) A forth section was also identified on the back panel of the fence that was measured at approximately 5 feet and 2 inches in height. 5.) A fifth section located on the right panel of the fence was measured at approximately 5 feet and 5 inches in height. Additionally a section of the barbed-wire on the fence at the Humble Addition are not tightly fasted, the location of the loose barbed-wire is located on the back panel of the fence.

At the Well No. 3 plant, a section located on the right panel of the fence was measured to be approximately 5 feet and 1 inch in height. A second section was identified on the front panel of the fence that was measured at approximately 5 feet and 3 inches in height.

**Recommended Corrective Action:** Submit photographs demonstrating that the fence at the Humble Addition plant and the well No. 3 plant are at least 6 feet in height with three strands of barbed wire extending outward from the top of the fence at a 45 degree angle or that the intruder-resistant fence is at least eight feet in height. The aforementioned requirements are applicable to the entire fencing enclosure.

During the December 18, 2014 compliance investigation, it was noted that the City of Hearne has not obtained a sanitary control easement covering land within 150 feet of Well No. 3 and Well No. 4.

Recommended Corrective Action: Submit to the TCEQ Waco Regional Office documentation demonstrating that the City of Hearne has obtained a sanitary control easement covering land within 150 feet of Well No.3 and Well No.4. Also, submit documentation demonstrating that the easements have been filed with Robertson County.

Failure to provide adequate pressure tank capacity.

For more than 250 connections, the system must meet the following requirements: An elevated storage capacity of 100 gallons per connection or a pressure tank capacity of 20 gallons per connection. If pressure tanks are used, a maximum capacity of 30,000 gallons is sufficient for up to 2,500 connections. An elevated storage capacity of 100 gallons per connection is required for systems with more than 2,500 connections. Alternate methods of pressure maintenance may be proposed and will be approved if the criteria contained in subsection of this section are met.

On February 5, 2015, after reviewing the water system data for the City of Hearne, it was noted that the water supply is required to have a pressure tank capacity of 3,420 gallons; the current pressure tank capacity is measured at 3,000 gallons. This a 12% deficiency.

Recommended Corrective Action: Submit to the TCEQ Waco regional office documentation demonstrating that adequate pressure tank capacity has been achieved.

On April 2, 2014, Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) Investigator Mr. Fred Logan contacted Bethany Hearne Water Supply Corporation (WSC) licensed water operator, Mr. Terry Thomas, to schedule a comprehensive compliance investigation (CCI) at the Bethany Hearne WSC. The investigator informed Mr. Thomas of the purpose of the investigation.

An announced CCI was conducted on April 9, 2014, at the Bethany Hearne WSC. The investigation was conducted with the Bethany Hearne WSC Operator, Mr. Terry Thomas, During an exit interview, the violations noted during the investigation were discussed with Mr. Thomas, Mr. Thomas was advised of the optional 14 day Area of Concern policy and was informed that a Notice of Violation (NOV) letter will be sent to the Bethany Hearne WSC.

#### BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

On August 8, 2011, an announced CCI was conducted at the Bethany Hearne WSC. As a result of this investigation, the Bethany Hearne WSC was sent a NOV letter, dated August 29, 2011, with a compliance due date of October 3, 2011, The outstanding alleged violation was: Failure to conduct maintenance and housekeeping at the pressure tank and ground Storage tank site.

A registered mail receipt in the Waco Regional files indicates that the letter was received on September 1, 2011.

Area of Concern; Failure to provide a water system record that needed to be reviewed at the time of the investigation.

Additional Issues: The results of this investigation indicate that this water system's minimum required ground storage capacity has exceeded 85% of its existing capacity.

The Bethany Hearne WSC obtains water from the City of Hearne through one master meter located on FM 391. The water flows to two ground storage tank (GS) with hypochlorination provided prior to ground storage as needed. Two service pumps (SP) take suction from the GS and pump to distribution with a pressure tank (PT) floating on the system. The System serves approximately 183 retail service connections.

Exceptions and Alternative Capacity Requirements:

- 1. There are no alternative capacity requirements (ACRs) granted to the System.
- 2. There are no rule exceptions granted to the System.

#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

All water treatment units, storage and pressure maintenance facilities at the main water plant were observed during the investigation. Additionally, the disinfectant residual and pressure were measured within the distribution system.

Mr. Terry Thomas reported that the system serves 183 retail service connections. All capacity requirements were evaluated using the reported number of connections.

On April 22 and April 25, 2014, documentation was received from Mr. Thomas, Bethany Hearne WSC, that included the approval of the new ground storage tanks, a signed Customer Service Agreement, and a report of the internal inspection of the pressure tank. This was adequate to resolve the alleged violation.
