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
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APPLICATION OF QUADVEST, L.P. TO AMEND ITS WATER AND SEWER CERTIFICATES OF CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY AND TO DECERTIFY A PORTION OF ORCHARD CROSSING'S WATER AND SEWER CERTIFICATES IN LIBERTY COUNTY

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COMMISSION STAFF'S ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS RECOMMENDATION

COMES NOW the Staff (Staff) of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission), representing the public interest, and files this response to Order No. 1, Staff's Administrative Completeness Recommendation. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

I. BÅCKGROUND

On July 7, 2014, Quadvest, L.P. (Quadvest or the Applicant) filed with the Commission an application to amend two certificates of convenience and necessity (CCN) in Liberty County, Texas: water CCN No. 11612 and sewer CCN No. 20952. Quadvest's application also seeks to decertify a portion of Orchard Crossing's water CCN No. 12671 and sewer CCN No. 20765 in Liberty County.

On July 13, 2016, the administrative law judge (ALJ) issued Order No. 1, requiring Staff to file a recommendation regarding administrative completeness by August 8, 2016 and for the both the Applicant and Staff to file comments regarding how the application should be processed and proposing a procedural schedule. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

II. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON NOTICE AND THE APPLICATION

As detailed in the attached memorandum of Debbie Reyes Tamayo, Kristy Nguyen, and Andrew Novak of the Commission's Water Utilities Division (Attachment A), Staff has reviewed Quadvest's application and recommends that the application be deemed sufficient and accordingly accepted for filing.

Staff has included as Attachments B and C notice for the Applicant to provide that meets the requirements of 16 TEX. ADMIN: CODE § 24.106 (TAC). Staff recommends that the

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Applicant be directed to provide this approved notice to any districts, utilities, and cities within two (2) miles of the proposed service area, the county judge of each county wholly or partly included in the proposed area to be certified, each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partly included in the proposed service area, each city with an extraterritorial jurisdiction which overlaps with the proposed service area, and any landowners who own a tract of at least 25 acres which is wholly or partly located in the proposed service area. The attached memorandum includes a non-exhaustive list of entities to whom Quadvest should give notice. The Applicant should include a copy of a map showing the proposed service area with the individual notices, pursuant to 16 TAC § 24.106(a)(2). Additionally, Staff recommends that the Applicant publish the approved notice once each week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Liberty County, as required by 16 TAC § 24.106(c).

After Quadvest has completed issuing such notice, Staff further recommends that the Applicant file by September 23, 2016 a copy of the actual notice sent, including attachments, as well as the attached signed affidavits (Attachments D and E) affirming that such notice was issued.

III. PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

In support of the recommendation stated above, Staff proposes the following procedural schedule:

Event	Date
Deadline for Applicant to file with the Commission signed affidavits that the notice was given along with a copy of the notice sent to the affected parties and published in a newspaper of general circulation	September 23, 2016
Deadline for Staff to file a recommendation regarding the sufficiency of the notice	Within 10 days of the Applicant filing proof of completed notice with the Commission
Deadline to intervene	30 days after notice is issued

Staff intends to include an additional proposed procedural schedule with Staff's recommendation on the sufficiency of notice that includes deadlines for Staff to provide final maps and certificates, for the Applicant to file signed consent forms, and for Staff's recommendation on final disposition.

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IV. Additional Documentation Required for Review on the Merits

As also detailed in Staff's attached memorandum, Quadvest will need to provide further information and documentation during the merits-review stage of this application. First. Quadvest must provide written consent from the City of Plum Creek and from Liberty Lakes FWSD 1 allowing Quadvest to provide retail utility service within the city limits and the district boundaries respectively. Second, in regards to Quadvest's new water system to serve the Camino Real-Subdivision, Quadvest must provide an approval letter from TCEQ for either the plans and specifications or the Engineering Report and it must provide documentation indicating that the subdivision plat has been approved by Liberty County. Third, Quadvest should file a copy of its audited financial statements, including a balance sheet and income statement, for years ending on December 31, 2014 and December 31, 2015. If Quadvest does not have audited financial statements, it should file its unaudited statements from those same two years. Fourth, Quadvest should provide a three year business / financial plan'supporting Quadvest's ability to* provide continuous and adequate service to the certificated area and/or current customers remaining in the proposed area. The plan should include narrative support, income and expenses, and balance sheet information, including projected balance sheets, income statements, and expense statements. Finally, Quadvest must provide a copy of all debt issuances attributable to Quadvest, including the forms of debt issuance devices listed in the attached memorandum.

V. CONCLUSION

For the above stated reasons, Staff respectfully requests that the ALJ issue an order deeming Quadvest's application administratively complete, requiring the Quadvest to provide notice in accordance with Staff's recommendation, and adopting the above proposed procedural schedule.

On July 7, 2016, Quadvest, L.P. (Quadvest) filed with the Public Utility Commission (Commission) an application to amend its water certificate of convenience (CCN) No. 11612 and sewer CCN No. 20952 and to decertify a portion of Orchard Crossing's water CCN No. 12671 and sewer CCN No. 20765 in Liberty County, Texas. Quadvest seeks to amend its CCNs to provide water and sewer utility services to Camino Real Subdivision Sections 1-3, consisting of 1,698 acres with zero current customers.

Staff has reviewed the information provided by the Applicant and recommends that the application be deemed administratively complete and sufficient for filing. Staff further recommends the following:

- 1) The Applicant be ordered to provide correct notice of the application to the following:
 - a) any districts, utilities, and cities within two (2) miles of the proposed service area;
 - b) the county judge of each county and each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partly included in the proposed area to be certified;
 - c) each city with an extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ) that is wholly or partly included in the proposed area to be certified;
 - d) landowners who own a tract of land that is at least 25 acres and is wholly or partly located in the proposed area to be certified. The landowner information may be obtained from the county appraisal district tax rolls for the county or counties in which the proposed CCN is located; and
 - e) publish notice once each week for two (2) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Liberty County.

- 3) The Applicant be ordered to include copy of a map showing the proposed service area with the individual notices to neighboring utilities, other affected parties and each landowner. It is the Applicant's burden to provide an accurate map delineating the proposed area with each individual notice. Information related to districts including addresses can be obtained from the TCEQ's web site located at <u>http://www14.tceq.texas.gov/iwud/</u>. And

Staff recommends the Applicant file within 30 days of the Commission order, a copy of the actual notice and map issued, along with signed affidavits indicating that the notice was given. It is recommended that the Applicant use the attached notices and affidavits to meet these requirements.

Technical Review

The items listed below will be addressed during Staff's technical review of the application. Failure to provide the requested information may delay processing of the application.

- 1) Written consent from both *City of Plum Creek* and *Liberty Lakes FWSD 1* allowing the Applicant to provide retail service within the city limits and district boundaries.
- 2) For the Applicant's new water system to serve the Camino Real Subdivision Addition:
 - Provide a plans and specifications approval letter or Engineering Report approval letter from the TCEQ; and
 - Documentation confirming subdivision plat approval by Liberty County.

Financial Review

- 1) Please provide Quadvest L.P.'s audited financial statements including a balance sheet and income statement for the years ending:
 - December 31, 2014; and
 - December 31, 2015.
- 2) If Quadvest L.P.'s financial statements are unaudited, please still provide a copy of those financial statements (income statement and balance sheet) for the years ending:
 - December 31, 2014; and
 - December 31, 2015.
- 3) Please provide a three year business/financial plan including narrative, income and expenses, and balance sheet information supporting Quadvest L.P.'s ability to provide continuous and adequate service to the certificated area and/or current customers remaining in the proposed area. The plan should include projected balance sheets, income statements, and expense statements.
- 4) Provide all debt issuances attributable to Quadvest L.P., including:
 - Date of issue,
 - Date of maturity,
 - Amount issued,
 - Amount outstanding,
 - Nominal rate of interest,
 - Issuance expenses,
 - Net proceeds,
 - Effective interest rate,
 - Type of debt,
 - Payee, and
 - Purpose of proceeds.
