### Request

Referencing Hickson Rebuttal, Exhibit MH-R-1, Commitment 26:

d. Will NextEra seek to include these costs as part of Oncor's regulated cost of service? If yes, please explain the factual and legal basis for requiring these costs to be recovered by Oncor ratepayers.

#### Response

The following response was prepared by or under the direct supervision of Stephen N. Ragland, the sponsoring witness for this response.

Yes. Oncor would seek to include in its regulated cost of service the reasonable and necessary costs associated with NextEra Energy's Revised Regulatory Commitment 26. Although NextEra Energy made this commitment in response to Commission Staff witness Mr. Randall Vickroy's direct testimony, Oncor's costs for its Affiliate Standards Compliance Plan, including its Compliance Officer, have been a recurring cost of service since 2000 when the Commission approved the Oncor Code of Conduct. These costs are not incremental to the Proposed Transactions.

The legal basis for the recovery of the costs described in this response include the Public Utility Regulatory Act and the Commission Substantive Rules.
