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APPLICATION OF SHERMAN'S MILL WATER SUPPLY CORPORATION TO OBTAIN A WATER CERTIFICATE OF CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY IN KERR COUNTY

COMMISSION STAFF'S SUPPLEMENTAL RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

Comes now the Staff ("Staff") of the Public Utility Commission of Texas ("Commission"), representing the public interest, and files its Supplemental Recommendation on Administrative Completeness in response to Order No. 3. In support thereof, Staff would show the following:

I. Background

On September 19, 2016, Sherman's Mill Water Supply Corporation ("Applicant") filed an application to obtain a new water certificate of convenience and necessity ("CCN") in Kerr County. The proposed total area being requested includes approximately 48 acres and 15 current customers. On October 21, 2016, the Administrative Law Judge (the "ALJ") issued Order No. 3, requiring Sherman's Mill to amend its application to cure certain deficiencies and requiring Staff to file additional comments on administrative completeness and propose a procedural schedule by November 30, 2016. This pleading is therefore timely filed.

II. Staff's Recommendation

Staff has reviewed Sherman Mill's amended application that includes supplemental filings, and as detailed by the attached memorandum of Debbie Reyes Tamayo, Kristi Nguyen, Fred Bednarski III, and Ricky Herrera of the Water Utilities Division, Staff recommends that the application be deemed administratively complete and sufficient for filing.

Staff has also included as an attachment hereto a form of proposed notice for Sherman's Mill to use that meets the requirements of 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 24.106 (TAC). Staff recommends that Sherman's Mill be directed to provide this notice to: (i) any districts, utilities, and cities within five miles of the proposed service area; (ii) the county judge of each county and each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partly included in the proposed area to be certified; (iii) each city with an extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ) that is wholly or partly included

in the proposed area to be certified; and (iv) landowners who own a tract of land that is at least 25 acres and is wholly or partly located in the proposed area to be certified. The attached memorandum includes a list of additional neighboring entities to whom Sherman's Mill should give notice. Sherman's Mill should include a copy of a map showing the proposed service area with the individual notices, pursuant to 16 TAC § 24.106(a)(2). Additionally, Staff recommends that Sherman's Mill publish notice once each week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Kerr County, as required by 16 TAC § 24.106(c).

Staff recommends that Sherman's Mill file, within 30 days of Commission Order No. 4, a copy of the actual notice and map sent, along with signed affidavits indicating that the notice was given.

III. Proposed Procedural Schedule

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Staff recommends the application be found administratively complete. Staff therefore proposes the following procedural schedule:

Event	Date
Deadline for Applicant to file with the Commission signed affidavits that the notice was given along with a copy of the notice sent to the affected parties and published in a newspaper of general circulation	January 20, 2017
Deadline for Staff to file a recommendation on sufficiency of notice	Within 10 days of the Applicant filing proof of completed notice with the Commission
Deadline to intervene	30 days after notice is issued

Staff intends to file an additional proposed procedural schedule with its recommendation on sufficiency of notice that includes deadlines for Staff to provide final maps and certificates, for the Applicant to file signed consent forms, and for Staff to file its recommendation on final disposition.

IV. Conclusion

Staff respectfully requests the ALJ issue an order deeming Sherman's Mill's application administratively complete, requiring Sherman's Mill to provide notice in accordance with Staff's recommendation, and adopting the above proposed procedural schedule.

On September 19, 2016, Sherman's Mill WSC (Applicant) filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) an application requesting to obtain a water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) in Kerr County, Texas. The application is being reviewed under Texas Water Code §13.254(d) (TWC) and 16 Tex. Admin. Code §§24.115 and 24.102(a)(1) (TAC). The proposed total area being requested includes approximately 48 acres and 15 current customers.

A Staff review of supplemental filings on November 10, 2016, found that the information is sufficient for filing and recommends the application be deemed administratively complete. Staff further recommends the Applicant:

1) Provide notice of the application to the following:

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- a) any districts, utilities, and cities within five (5) miles of the proposed area;
- b) the county judge of each county and each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partly included in the proposed area to be certified;
- c) each city with an extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ) that is wholly or partly included in the proposed area to be certified;
- d) landowners who own a tract of land that is at least 25 acres and is wholly or partly located in the proposed area to be certified. The landowner information may be obtained from the county appraisal district tax rolls for the county or counties in which the proposed CCN is located; and
- e) publish notice once each week for two (2) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Kerr County.

- 3) Include copy of a map showing the proposed service area with the individual notices to neighboring utilities, and other affected parties and each landowner. It is the Applicant's burden to provide an accurate map delineating the proposed area with each individual notice. Information related to districts including addresses can be obtained from the TCEQ's web site located at <u>http://www14.tceq.texas.gov/iwud/</u>.
- 4) Within 30 days of the Commission order, file a copy of the actual notice sent, the map that was sent with the individual notice, and the attached signed affidavit that the notice was given. It is recommended that the Applicant use the attached notice and affidavits to meet these requirements.

within thirty (30) days from the date of this publication or notice. A public hearing will be held only if a legally sufficient hearing request is received or if the Commission on its own motion requests a hearing. Only those individuals who submit a written hearing request or a written request to be notified if a hearing is set will receive notice if a hearing is scheduled. If a public hearing is requested, the Commission will not issue the CCN and will forward the application to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH) for a hearing. If no settlement is reached and an evidentiary hearing is held, SOAH will submit a recommendation to the Commission for final decision. If an evidentiary hearing is held, it will be a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.

If you are a landowner with a tract of land at least 25 acres or more, that is partially or wholly located within the proposed service area, you may request to be excluded from the proposed service area (or "opt out") by providing written notice to the Commission within (30) days from the date that notice was provided by the applicant. All requests to opt out of the requested service area must include a large scale map and a metes and bounds description of the tract of land.

Persons who meet the requirements to opt out, and wish to request this option should file the required documents with the:
