MANAGEMENT & TRAINING CORPORATION'S AMENDMENT TO ITS ORIGINAL PETITION AND REPLY TO THE CITY OF OVERTON'S . <u>RESPONSE TO PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION'S ORDER NO. 1</u>

COMES NOW, Management & Training Corporation ("MTC"), a corporation based in Centerville, Utah, and files this Reply to the City of Overton's Response to the Public Utility Commission of Texas's (the "Commission") Order No. 1, pursuant to 16 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 22.78(a) ("Reply").

Background

MTC is a private company that has contracted with the Texas Department of Criminal Justice to operate the Billy Moore Correctional Center ("**Prison**"), located in Overton, Texas. The Prison receives commercial retail water and sewer service from the City of Overton (the "**City**") and is located approximately three miles outside of the City's corporate boundaries. The Prison is the only commercial customer, residing outside the City's corporate boundaries, that has a meter six inches or larger.

On June 10, 2016, the City Manager, Charles Cunningham, emailed the Warden of the Prison, David Hudson, to inform him that the City would be significantly increasing the Prison's water and sewer rates. A copy of the email is attached to the Petition as <u>Exhibit A</u>. On July 14, 2016, the Overton City Council adopted Ordinance No. 2016-05-19B (the "Ordinance"). A copy of the Ordinance is attached to the Petition as <u>Exhibit B</u>. Among other things, the Ordinance

amended the City's retail water and sewer rates for commercial customers with meters six inches or larger.

On October 12, 2016, MTC filed its original petition, wherein MTC requested the Commission review the decision of the City Council to determine if the newly adopted water and sewer rates were just, reasonable, and not discriminatory pursuant to TEX. WATER CODE § 13.043(b)(3) and 16 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§ 24.41(b), (i) (the "**Petition**"). The Commission responded on October 14, 2016, by issuing Order No. 1. On October 20, 2016, the Prison's office email¹ sent an email to David Hudson, the Prison's Warden, and attached the City of Overton's Response to the Commission's Order No. 1 (the "**Response**"). A copy of the office e-mail, which evidences the date the Warden received the Response, is attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u>. Therefore, it is presumed MTC did not receive the Response until October 20, 2016; thus, in accordance with the Commission's Order No. 1 and 16 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 22.78(a), this Reply is timely filed.

In support hereof, MTC respectfully shows as follows:

Reply to City of Overton's Response to Commission Order No. 1

In the City's Response, it alleges (i) that the City had "not been served in any manner, and is not in receipt of, any petition reportedly filed by" MTC, (ii) that the Prison was one of City's twenty-six (26) customers that reside outside of the City's corporate boundaries, and (iii) that MTC's original Petition was unwarranted. However, these assertions are inaccurate.

Regarding the assertion that the City was not provided a copy of the Petition, MTC has verification from the U.S. Post Office that the City received a notification on October 15, 2016, that informed the City it had a certified mail item from Morgan Johnson at McGinnis Lochridge, MCT's counsel, ready for pick-up. However, the City did not pick-up the Petition until October

20, 2016. Attached as <u>Exhibit B</u> is the U.S. Post Office Verification of Delivery document that evidences the date the City received notice of the certified mail item and the date the City signed the green card for the Petition. Attached as <u>Exhibit C</u> is the McGinnis Lochridge Certified Mail Log Sheet that evidences a document was mailed by certified mail to Charles Cunningham on October 12, 2016. The Transmittal Letter that MTC used when it sent a copy of the Petition to the City Manager by Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested is attached to the Petition as <u>Exhibit D</u>.

As demonstrated in the minutes of the City Council meeting held on July 14, 2016, wherein the City adopted the Ordinance, the Prison is the only customer subject to the newly adopted water and sewer rates. During the City Council meeting, the City Manager explained the method by which he calculated the "prisons" new water and sewer rates. The City Manager did not discuss any other customer class, residential or commercial, that would be subject to the new rates. Furthermore, the water and sewer rates discussed at the meeting were only applicable to commercial customers with meters six inches or greater. Attached as **Exhibit C** to the Petition are the minutes from the City of Overton City Council Special Called Meeting, dated July 14, 2016. Therefore, the Prison constitutes 100% "of the ratepayers whose rates have been changed and who are eligible to appeal" pursuant to Tex. Water Code 13.043(b).

MTC's Petition, wherein MTC protested and appealed the decision of the City to increase the water and sewer rates for the Prison and respectfully requested the Commission to review the decision of the City and determine if the newly adopted rates were just, reasonable and not discriminatory, is warranted and valid pursuant to TEX. WATER CODE § 13.043(b)(3) and 16 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§ 24.41(b), (i). As evidenced in the minutes of the City Council meeting, the water base rate was increased by 27%, the water volume rate was increased by 10%; the sewer base rate was increased by 52% and the sewer volume rate was increased by 52%. See <u>Exhibit C</u>

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of the Petition. The City Manager explained in an email to the Prison's Warden that the Prison's new rates were determined from rate study that combined all expensed incurred by the City to provide water and sewer service, and subsequently allocated those expenses to customers based on the amount of water consumed by each customer class. See <u>Exhibit A</u> of the Petition.

Conclusion

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, MTC respectfully requests that the Commission deny the relief requested in the City of Overton's Response, review the City of Overton's newly adopted sewer and water rates for the Prison to determine if the rates are just, reasonable and not discriminatory, and grant MTC any other and further relief to which it may show itself to be entitled.
