COMMISSION STAFF'S SUPPLEMENTAL RECOMMENDATION FINDING APPLICATION ADMINISTRATIVELY INCOMPLETE

COMES NOW the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and files this Response to Order No. 3 and Supplemental Recommendation Finding Application Administratively Incomplete. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

I. Background

On November 9, 2016, the City of Lucas (Lucas) filed an application to amend water certificate of convenience and necessity no. 10193 in Collin County. On May 1, 2017, Order No. 4 was issued finding the application incomplete and deficient and requiring Lucas to amend its application to cure the deficiencies noted by Staff by May 23, 2017. On May 23, 2017, Lucas amended its application. Order No. 4 also required Staff to file a supplemental recommendation regarding the administrative completeness of the application and proposed notice by June 23, 2017. Accordingly, this pleading is timely filed.

II. Recommendation on Administrative Sufficiency

Staff has reviewed the information provided by Lucas on May 23, 2017 and as supported by the attached memorandum of Jolie Mathis, Engineering Specialist and Gary Horton, GIS Specialist with the Water Utilities Division, continues to recommend that the application be deemed administratively incomplete and deficient. Pursuant to 16 TAC § 24.8(a), applications are not considered filed until a determination of administrative completeness is made. In order to continue processing the application, Staff recommends that Lucas provide the following requested information:

Mapping Content

- 1. A general location map identifying the requested area in reference to the nearest county boundary, city, or town.
- 2. A detailed map identifying the requested area in reference to verifiable man-made and natural landmarks, such as roads, rivers, and railroads.
- 3. Digital mapping data for the requested area, as a single polygon record, in shapefile (SHP) format, georeferenced in either NAD83 Texas Statewide Mapping System (Meters) or NAD83 Texas State Plane Coordinate System (US Feet); OR metes and bounds survey sealed or embossed by either a licensed state surveyor or a registered professional land surveyor.

Staff's review of CCN applications is a meticulous, time intensive practice, and Staff has limited resources to process this kind of application. Lucas has the burden of providing the required information with its application in a timely manner. Processing of the application cannot proceed until the requested items are received and reviewed. Staff recommends that Lucas discuss how to resolve the mapping deficiencies with PUC mapping staff. In order to afford Staff the opportunity to provide a thorough analysis of this application, Staff respectfully recommends that Lucas cure the deficiencies in its application by July 21, 2017 and that Staff be required to provide a supplemental recommendation by August 18, 2017.

III. Proposed Procedural Schedule

Due to the continued deficiencies in the application; Staff does not recommend a procedural schedule for the evaluation of the merits at this time. Staff recommends that the Applicants cure the deficiencies in its application by July 21, 2017 and that Staff be required to provide a supplemental recommendation by August 18, 2017.

IV. Conclusion

Staff respectfully requests that an order be issued consistent with this Recommendation.

On November 9, 2016, the City of Lucas (Applicant) filed an application to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 10193 in Collin County, Texas. This application is being reviewed pursuant to the criteria in the Texas Water Code Chapter 13 (TWC), and under 16 Tex. Admin Code §§24.102 – 24.107 (TAC).

Staff has reviewed the information provided by the Applicant on May 23, 2017, and recommends the application be deemed administratively incomplete and not accepted for filing due to the deficiencies detailed below:

Mapping Content:

Maps submitted are deficient. Applicant must submit the following items to resolve the mapping deficiencies:

- 1. A general location map identifying the requested area in reference to the nearest county boundary, city, or town.
- 2. A detailed map identifying the requested area in reference to verifiable man-made and natural landmarks, such as roads, rivers, and railroads.
- 3. Digital mapping data for the requested area, as a single polygon record, in shapefile (SHP) format, georeferenced in either NAD83 Texas Statewide Mapping System (Meters) or NAD83 Texas State Plane Coordinate System (US Feet); OR metes and bounds survey sealed or embossed by either a licensed state surveyor or a registered professional land surveyor.
