## ORDER NO. 3 FINDING APPLICATION REMAINS INCOMPLETE AND DEFICIENT, ESTABLISHING DEADLINES AND OPPORTUNITY TO CURE

This Order addresses Commission Staff's February 14, 2017 recommendation that the application of the City of Lucas to obtain a certificate of convenience and necessity in Collin County remains incomplete and deficient. Commission Staff stated that Lucas has not amended or supplemented the application to address the deficiencies identified in Commission Staff's December 9, 2016 recommendation. Therefore Lucas's application continues to be materially deficient, as specifically described in Commission Staff's December 9, 2016 pleading and attached memorandum and as supplemented in Commission Staff's February 14, 2017 pleading.

Consistent with Commission Staff's February 14, 2017 recommendation, Lucas's application remains administratively incomplete and deficient. In accordance with 16 Texas Administrative Code § 24.8(a), applications are not considered filed until a determination of administrative completeness is made; thus, at this time, this application is not considered filed with the Commission.

On or before **March 24, 2017**, Lucas shall amend its application to cure the deficiencies identified by Commission Staff in its December 9, 2016 pleading and attached memorandum and in its February 14, 2017 pleading. Processing of the application cannot proceed until the requested items are received and reviewed. On or before **April 26, 2017**, Commission Staff shall file submit a supplemental recommendation on this application.
