I, along with my neighbor, Phil Berryman have made a request to the City of Cumby, Texas to provide water to us and was waiting for Cumby, Texas to expand their CCN.

Mr. Berryman and I own a total of over 300 acres (I own 150 acres) wherein the requested area for Cash SUD is 8 acres. There is no location of the lines on the proposal which leaves me in the dark as to if I am going to face a condemnation proceeding to furnish water to someone else. There is no information available in this notice to educate the consumer as to the potential cost to that consumer if Cash SUD is allowed to expand their CCN at the exclusion of Cumby's CCN.

5. Your proposed adjustment to the application which would satisfy your concerns and cause you to withdraw your request for a hearing.

My proposed adjustment could only come after a more detailed rendition of the area wherein Cash SUD intends to run its lines and the parties to whom the service is intended. The request is to service an 8 acre area within a much larger service area. To lock-in a CCN for that large of an area with no mention of what happens to those located outside the 8 acres makes it almost impossible to propose an adjustment. The requested area map, which is attached to the notice, does not give much detail as to where the lines will be located and exactly what areas they intend to provide water. Does it include the rest stops only? Is it available for others in the area, and at what cost, if any? Will easements need to be sought and if so, from whom? Where are the lines going to be run? The request is too vague and incomplete for me to propose an adjustment at this point. If the Notice and included drawings were amended and some of the areas of concern were addressed and memorialized by Cash, I could at that time decide as to whether or not withdraw this request for a hearing and could possibly negotiate to support this amendment.
