RE: Tariff Control No. 46838 – Application of Quadvest Water and Sewer Utility for a Pass-Through Rate Change

NOTICE OF APPROVAL

This Notice addresses Quadvest Water and Sewer Utility's annual true-up report for its current combined regional pass-through rate and request that its tariff be amended to replace the combined pass-through provision with individual pass-through provisions for the several districts that are affected: Bluebonnet Groundwater Conservation District (GCD), Brazoria County GCD, City of Rosenberg, Harris-Galveston Subsidence District, West Harris County Regional Water Authority (WA), North Fort Bend WA, North Harris County Regional WA, and the San Jacinto River Authority. Quadvest filed supplemental information on March 30, 2017 and May 25, 2017.

On May 26, 2017, Commission Staff recommended that the application, as amended, is sufficient and should be approved, as specified in the pleading and attached memorandum of Andrew Novak of the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division. Commission Staff stated that Quadvest's revenues and expenses were properly trued up and all over-collections have been credited back to customers.¹ Commission Staff stated that Quadvest cannot request another combined pass-through rate until three years after the replacement is approved, unless good cause is shown.² Commission Staff recommended approval of Quadvest's request for a

tariff amendment replacing the combined pass-through rate into individual pass-through rates, per district. Commission Staff calculated the new individual pass-through rates based on the previously approved rate, with certain changes. Commission Staff provided revised tariff pages for Quadvest.

Consistent with Commission Staff's recommendation, Quadvest's application, as amended, is sufficient and it is approved. Quadvest's tariff is amended; the combined passthrough provision is replaced with individual pass-through provisions, as follows. A passthrough rate of \$0.07 per 1,000 gallons for Bluebonnet GCD is approved. A pass-through rate of \$0.04 per 1,000 gallons for Brazoria County GCD is approved. A pass-through rate of \$2.23 per 1,000 gallons for the City of Rosenberg is approved. A pass-through rate of \$0.02 per 1,000 gallons for the Harris-Galveston Subsidence District is approved. A pass-through rate of \$2.54 per 1,000 gallons for the West Harris County Regional WA is approved. A passthrough rate of \$3.52 per 1,000 gallons for the North Fort Bend WA is approved. A passthrough rate of \$3.45 per 1,000 gallons for the North Harris County Regional WA is approved. A pass-through rate of \$2.91 per 1,000 gallons for the San Jacinto River Authority is approved. A pass-through rate of \$3.66 per 1,000 gallons is approved for Shaw Acres. Quadvest may file individual applications for each district for further pass-through implementations in accordance with each district's tariff. Quadvest may not request another combined passthrough provision until three years have passed since the date of this Notice, unless good cause is shown. The approved revised tariff pages for Quadvest are attached to this Notice.

Bluebonnet GRP (BGCD), Brazoria GRP (BCGCD), City of Rosenburg GRP (CR), North Fort Bend GRP (NFBWA), West Harris County Regional Water Authority (WHCRWA), Harris-Galveston Subsidence District (HGSD), North Harris County Regional Water Authority (NHCRWA) San Jacinto River Authority GRP (SJRA) and Shaw Acres. TEMPORARY WATER RATE:

Unless otherwise superseded by PUC order or rule, if the Utility is ordered by a court or government body of competent jurisdiction to reduce its pumpage, production or water sales, the Utility shall be authorized to increase its approved gallonage charge according to the formula:

TGC = <u>cgc+(pr)(cgc)(r)</u> (1.0-r) Where: TGC = temporary gallonage charge

cgc = current gallonage charge

- r = water use reduction expressed as a decimal fraction (the pumping restriction)
- prr = percentage of revenues to be recovered expressed as a decimal fraction, for this tariff prr shall equal 0.5

To implement the Temporary Water Rate, the Utility must comply with all notice and other requirements of 16 TAC 24.21(1).

PURCHASED WATER AND/OR DISTRICT FEE PASS THROUGH CLAUSE:

Changes in fees imposed by any non-affiliated third party water supplier or underground water district having jurisdiction over the Utility shall be passed through as an adjustment to the water gallonage charge according to the following formula:

 $RVP = (E+(AP-AC))/(JC \times AU)$, Where:

RVP = Adjusted gallonage charge, rounded to the nearest cent

E = Estimated sum of upcoming 12 months of purchase water and groundwater conservation district costs

AP = Actual payments up to 12 months (February through January of previous year)

AC = Actual collections up to 12 months (February through January of previous year)

JC = January month end customer connections

AU= Average annual usage per connection from most recent rate case

The adjusted gallonage charge must be trued up and adjusted every twelve months.

To implement, all notice requirements must be met.

With the annual true up report adjusting the pass through for the next 12 months, the utility shall provide a five year report showing the annual and accumulated difference between pass through amounts collected from customers and amounts actually paid to the entities whose charges are included in the pass through and the formula for the estimates included in the pass through charge, the definition of all variables used in the estimate, the basis for any projections and any standard operating procedures of the utility for estimating.

PASS THROUGH PROVISION:

For utilities subject to changes in cost imposed by any non-affiliated provider of purchased water or sewer or a groundwater conservation district having jurisdiction over the Utility, these increases (decreases) shall be passed through as an adjustment to the gallonage charge according to the formula:

AG = G+B/(1-L), Where:

AG = adjusted gallonage charge, rounded to the nearest one cent

- G = approved gallonage charge per 1,000 gallons
- B = change in fee (per 1,000 gallons)

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L = water or sewer line loss from preceding 12 months, not to exceed 0.15 (15%)

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
