COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON SUFFICIENCY AND FINAL DISPOSITION

COMES NOW the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest and files this Recommendation on Sufficiency and Final Disposition, and would show the following:

I. Background

On February 8, 2017, The Commons Water Supply, Inc. (The Commons), holder of Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 12781, filed an application to implement a pass-through rate increase due to an increase in water use fees imposed on the utility by the City of Houston. The rate increase will affect The Commons of Lake Houston subdivision, public water system #1012978. The requested effective date for the pass-through rate change is April 1, 2017.

On March 6, 2017, the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) issued the Notice Finding Application Deficient, directing The Commons to file proof that corrected notice had been provided to the utility's customers. The ALJ also instructed Staff to provide a supplemental recommendation by March 31, 2017. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

II. Recommendation on Sufficiency and Notice

Staff has reviewed The Commons's application, and in accordance with Tex. Water Code, Chapter 13, and 16 Tex. Admin. Code §24.21 (TAC), and as supported by the attached memorandum of Jonathan Ramirez of the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division, Staff recommends that the application and notice be deemed administratively complete and sufficient. On March 30, 2017, The Commons filed a copy of their corrected notice that was provided to their customers as required by 16 TAC §24.21(b).



III. Recommendation on Final Disposition

Staff recommends that The Commons's application is administratively complete and complies with the requirements of 16 TAC § 24.21. Therefore, as supported by Jonathan Ramirez's attached memorandum, Staff recommends approval of The Commons's application to increase the purchased water pass-through rate from \$.071 to \$.89 per 1,000 gallons of water usage. Staff recommends that an approved tariff incorporating the pass-through adjustment, of which a proposed copy is attached, be provided to The Commons.

IV. Conclusion

Staff respectfully requests that the ALJ issue an order consistent with the above recommendations.

On February 8, 2017, The Commons Water Supply, Inc. (Applicant), Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 12781, requested approval to implement a pass-through rate increase due to increases in the water use fees imposed on the Applicant by the City of Houston (City). The Commons of Lake Houston, public water system (PWS) No. #1012978 is the subdivision and water system affected by the pass-through rate increase. The requested effective date for the pass-through rate change is April 1, 2017.

The applicant proposed to increase the purchased water pass through rate fee from \$.071 to \$.89 per 1,000 gallons of water usage. Staff confirmed that the City of Houston has increased its rates using the documents provided with the application. The Applicant refiled a copy of the corrected notice that was provided to customers including the correct PWS No. #1012978 on March 30, 2017.

Based upon review of the information submitted, Staff finds that the application is sufficient and recommends that the Commission:

- 1. Find that the application is sufficient for filing;
- 2. Approve the pass-through application as filed; and,
- 3. Provide a copy of an approved tariff to the Applicant (attached).

SECTION 1.0 -- RATE SCHEDULE (Continued)

Pass Through Provision:

For Utilities subject to changes in costs imposed by any non-affiliated provider of purchased water or sewer or a groundwater conservation district having jurisdiction over the Utility, these increases (decreases) shall be passed through as an adjustment to the gallonage charge according to the formula:

AG = G + B/(1-L)

Where:

AG = adjusted gallonage charge, rounded to nearest one cent

G = approved gallonage charge, per 1,000 gallons

B = changed in fee (per 1,000 gallons)

L = water or sewer line loss for preceding 12 months, not to exceed 0.15 (15%)
