COMMISSION STAFF'S SUPPLEMENTAL RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

COMES NOW the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and files this Supplemental Recommendation on Administrative Completeness in Response to Order No. 2 and would show the following:

I. BACKGROUND

On May 1, 2017, Blackland Water Supply Corporation (Blackland) and the City of Royse City (City) (collectively, Applicants) filed an application for sale, transfer, or merger of facilities and certificate rights in Rockwall County, Texas. Specifically, the City seeks to acquire a portion of Blackland's facilities and certificate rights under water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) No. 11305. Blackland filed supplements to its application on July 6, 10, and 11, 2017.

On June 5, 2017, Order No. 2 was issued, establishing a deadline of August 4, 2017 for Staff to file a supplemental recommendation on the administrative completeness of the application and notice and propose a procedural schedule for further processing of the application. This pleading is therefore timely filed.

II. ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

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As detailed in the attached memorandum from Debbie Reyes Tamayo in the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division, Staff has reviewed the application and supplemental information filed by Blackland, and recommends that it be found administratively complete.

III. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Staff recommends the application be found administratively complete. Staff therefore proposes the following procedural schedule:

On May 1, 2017, City of Royse City (Royse City or Buyer), Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 12827 and Blackland Water Supply Corporation (Blackland WSC or Seller), CCN No. 11305, (collectively, Applicants) filed an application for Sale, Transfer, or Merger (STM) of facilities in Rockwell County, Texas, pursuant to Texas Water Code (TWC) §§ 13.241, 13.246, 13.301 and 16 Tex. Admin. Code §§ 24.102 and 24.109. Specifically, Royse City seeks approval to acquire a portion of water system assets and water service area from Blackland WSC.

Staff has reviewed the information provided and recommends that the application be deemed administratively complete and sufficient for filing. Staff recommends the Applicants be directed to provide notice as described below.

 - c. each city with an extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ) that is wholly or partly included in the requested area to be certified;
 - d. any customers transferred, or other affected parties in the requested area.
- 2) The Applicants provide notice to the following:
 - BHP WSC (CCN No. 10064)
 - Cash SUD (CCN No. 10824)
 - City of Fate (CCN No. 12889)
 - Parker Creek Estates LP (CCN No. 13071)
 - Parker Creek MUD
 - Rockwall County Judge
 - Rockwall County MUD 7

The Applicants should include a map showing the proposed service area with the individual notices to neighboring utilities and other affected parties. It is the Applicant's burden to provide an accurate map delineating the proposed area with each individual notice. Information related to districts including addresses can be obtained by the Applicant from the TCEQ web site located at <u>http://www14.tceq.texas.gov/iwud/</u>.

Within 30 days of the Commission order, Staff recommends that the Applicants be required to file a copy of the actual individual notice sent with attached signed and notarized affidavit that the notice was given.

If no settlement is reached and an evidentiary hearing is held, SOAH will submit a recommendation to the Commission for final decision. An evidentiary hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.
