#### Background

On July 7, 2017, Kerr County Water Systems, LLC (Kerr County WS) Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 13166, filed an application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) for a water rate/tariff change with an effective date of August 6, 2017, in Kerr County, Texas. The increase affects approximately 88 connections. The application was filed pursuant to Texas Water Code (TAC) §§ 13.041, 13.042(e), 13.181 – 13.185, and 13.1871 and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §§ 24.25 – 24.33 (previously 24.21 - 24.26). The increase affects the Bumblebee Hills Water Systems public water system (PWS) No. 1330092.

#### **Staff Recommendation**

After review of the application, Staff recommends that the Commission approve the stipulated rates and find that the rate change complies with the requirements of TWC §§ 13.182, 13.183, 13.185 and 16 TAC § 24.41 for the reasons discussed below.

Kerr County WS requested a total revenue requirement of \$90,346. However, the stipulated rates generate a total revenue of approximately \$70,684.

The stipulation includes an adjustment to rate base from \$38,815 to \$281,975, due to including rate base items found by Staff that should have been included in the application. The adjustment to rate base created an adjustment to the annual depreciation expense of \$1,243, from \$5,896 to \$7,114. Along with the change to rate base is an adjustment to the rate of return from 11.58% to

6.98%. These two adjustments combined increased return from \$3,518 to \$6,165. These changes resulted in a decrease to federal income taxes due to flow through calculations of \$23,527, from \$24,691 to \$1,165. The total revenue requirement included in the stipulation is \$70,684. Staff agrees that approval of the stipulated rates is reasonable and in the public interest.

#### Rate Design

Staff reviewed the proposed rate design the application. Staff used the reported number of gallons billed, and the approximate number of customers. The proposed rates are reasonable with respect to each customer.

By stipulation, Kerr County and Commission Staff have resolved and settled the outstanding issues related to the rates Kerr County may charge for water services and enter into agreement on the rates below. Beginning on the effective date, Kerr County and Commission Staff agree that the monthly charge for water service shall be set at the following rates below.

#### **Conclusion**

Based on this review, Staff recommends that the Commission:

- 1. Find that the stipulation is in the public interest;
- 2. Approve the rates and the tariff provisions included in the stipulation; and
- 3. Provide a copy of the tariff to the Applicant.
