COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON SUFFICIENCY OF NOTICE

COMES NOW the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and files this Recommendation on Sufficiency of Notice in response to Order No. 3 and would show the following:

I. BACKGROUND

On June 1, 2017, Hickory Creek Special Utility District (HCSUD) filed an application to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 10809 in Hunt and Fannin counties. HCSUD filed supplemental information on August 3, 2017.

On September 8, 2017, Order No. 3 was issued establishing a deadline of ten working days from the filing of proof of completed notice for Staff to file a recommendation on the sufficiency of notice. HCSUD filed proof of notice on October 19, 2017. Ten working days from October 19 is November 2, 2017. This pleading is therefore timely filed.

II. SUFFICIENCY OF NOTICE

As detailed in the attached memorandum from Andrew Novak in the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division, Staff has reviewed the proof of notice filed by HCSUD and recommends that notice be deemed sufficient.

III. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Staff recommends the notice be found sufficient. Staff therefore proposes the following procedural schedule:

IV. CONCLUSION

For the reasons detailed above, Staff recommends that HCSUD's notice be deemed sufficient and that the procedural schedule proposed above be adopted.

¹ Under 16 TAC § 24.106(a)(3), the intervention deadline is 30 days after the mailing or publication of notice, whichever occurs later. Notice was mailed on September 22, 2017, and published on September 27, 2017; October 3, 2017; October 4, 2017; and October 10, 2017. Therefore, 30 days after October 10 is November 9, 2017.

On June 1, 2017, Hickory Creek Special Utility District (Applicant) filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) an application to amend water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 10809 pursuant to Texas Water Code Ann. (TWC), §§ 13.242 to 13.250 and the 16 Tex. Admin Code (TAC) §§ 24.101 to 24.107. The Applicant is not seeking dual certification with the City of Wolfe City.

In response to Commission Order No. 3, the Applicant provided public notice to customers, neighboring systems, and affected parties in Hunt and Fannin Counties on September 22, 2017. On September 27 and October 4, 2017, notice was published in the Herald Banner as well as on October 3rd and October 10th in the Fannin County Leader. The affidavits of notice were filed with the Commission on October 19, 2017. Staff has reviewed the notice documents and recommends they be deemed sufficient.
