COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

COMES NOW the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and files this Recommendation on Administrative Completeness in response to Order No. 1 and would show the following:

I. BACKGROUND

On June 19, 2017, Chateau Woods Municipal Utility District (CWMUD) filed an application to amend its sewer Certificate of Convenience and Necessity No. 20937 in Montgomery County.

On June 21, 2017, Order No. 1 was issued, establishing a deadline of July 19, 2017 for Staff to file comments on the administrative completeness of the application and proposed notice and propose a procedural schedule. This pleading is therefore timely filed.

II. ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

As detailed in the attached memorandum from Jonathan Ramirez in the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division, Staff has reviewed the application and recommends that it be found administratively incomplete. Specifically, Staff has identified deficiencies in the mapping information submitted. Staff recommends that CWMUD submit additional mapping information, as further detailed in the attached memorandum.

III. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Staff recommends that the application be found administratively incomplete. Staff therefore recommends that a deadline of August 21, 2017, be established for CWMUD to supplement its application. Staff further recommends that a deadline of September 21, 2017, be

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established for Staff to review CWMUD's supplemental information and make a supplemental recommendation on the administrative completeness of the application.

IV. CONCLUSION

For the reasons discussed above, Staff recommends that the application be found administratively incomplete. Staff further recommends that the procedural schedule proposed above be adopted for further processing of this docket.

Amend a Sewer Certificate of Convenience and Necessity in Montgomery County

On June 19, 2017, Chateau Woods Municipal Utility District filed an application to amend its sewer Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 20937 in Montgomery County. The total area being requested includes approximately 9 acres and 25 customers. This application is being reviewed pursuant to Texas Water Code Ann. (TWC), §§ 13.242 to 13.250.

Based upon review of the information submitted with the application, Staff finds that the application contains deficiencies and therefore recommends the application be found administratively incomplete and insufficient for filing.
