COMMISSION STAFF'S RESPONSE TO NOTICE SETTING DEADLINE FOR STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION

COMES NOW the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest and files Commission Staff's Response to Notice Setting Deadline for Staff's Recommendation. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

I. BACKGROUND.

On July 3, 2017, Johnston Water Utility, LLC (Johnston) requested approval of a pass-through rate increase due to an increase in pumpage fees imposed on the utility by the North Harris County Regional Water Authority. The rate increase will affect the Powder Mill Estates, High Meadow Ranch, and Oaks of Rosehill subdivisions. The requested effective date for the pass-through rate change is August 1, 2017.

On July 6, 2017, a Notice Setting Deadline for Staff's recommendation was issued, establishing a deadline of July 17, 2017 for Staff to file a recommendation on Johnston's application and sufficiency of notice. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

II. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that Johnston's application is administratively complete and complies with the requirements of 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 24.21. Upon review, Johnston's notices do not contain the specific language required by 16 TAC § 24.21(b)(2)(E)(ii)(VI). However, Staff considers this omission to be minor, and recommends that it can be cured through revised notice to affected customers provided in the July 2017 bills. Therefore, as supported by the attached memorandum of Fred Bednarski of the Water Utilities Division, Staff recommends approval of Johnson's application to increase the North Harris County Regional Water Authority (NHCRWA) pumpage fee for the Oaks of Rosehill and Powder Mill Estates subdivisions, and the San Jacinto River Authority (SJRA) pumpage fee for the High Meadow subdivision. Staff

further recommends that Johnston be required to provide revised notice of the pass-through increase, as detailed in Mr. Bednarski's attached memorandum, to affected customers with the July 2017 bills.

III. - CONCLUSION

Staff respectfully requests that the ALJ issue an order consistent with this recommendation.

to Implement a Pass-Through Rate Change in Harris and Montgomery

Counties

On July 06, 2017, Johnston Water Utility, L.L.C. (JWUL or Applicant), certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) No. 12788, filed an application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (PUC) to implement an adjustment of its pass-through gallonage charges pursuant to 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 24.21(b)(2) (TAC). The pass-through adjustments reflect the increases in the well pumpage fees charged by North Harris County Regional Water Authority (NHCRWA) and San Jacinto River Authority (SJRA) JWUL is required to pay. The following subdivisions/public water systems (PWSs) are affected by the NHCRWA pumpage fee increase: Oak of Rosehill public (PWS) No. 1013066 and Powder Mill Estates, PWS No. 1012986. High Meadows, PWS No. 1700603 is the only subdivision effected by SJRA's well pumpage fee increase.

The pass-through rate increase for NHCRWA was effective on April 1, 2017. Based on the calculations, the new pass-through gallonage fee is \$3.06, replacing the previous tariff gallonage fee of \$2.54 per 1,000 gallons for the Powder-Mill Estates subdivision, and \$3.36 per 1,000 gallons replacing the previous tariff gallonage fee of \$2.79 for the Oaks of Rosehill subdivision.

The pass-through rate increase for SJRA is effective on September 1, 2017. Based on the calculations, the new pass-through gallonage fée is \$2.91, replacing the previous tariff fee of \$2.58 per 1,000 gallons for the High Meadow Subdivision.

Staff has reviewed all the calculations and determined that the application meet the requirements of 16 TAC § 24.21, and proposed increases are calculated correctly according to the currently approved tariff equation.

Staff has additionally reviewed the notices, and identified that the following language is missing from the notices pursuant to 16 TAC § 24.21 (b)(2)(E)(ii)(VI): "This tariff change is being implemented in accordance with the minor tariff changes allowed by 16 Texas Administrative Code §24.21. The cost to you as a result of this change will not exceed the costs charged to your utility." However, the notices do contain similar language, stating that "the cost of these charges to customers will not exceed Johnston Water Utility's increased cost of the pumpage fee." Staff considers the omission of the language from 16 TAC § 24.21(b)(2)(E)(ii)(VI) to be a minor omission that may be corrected through a future notice as recommended below.

Staff recommends that:

- 1. The application is sufficient for filing;
- 2. the Applicant be required to provide notice of the pass-through increase to affected customers with the July 2017 bills including the language pursuant to 16 TAC 24.21 (b)(2)(E)(ii)(VI). Consistent with the previous notices, these notices should contain an effective date of the rate increase of 8/1/2017 for subdivisions Powder Mill Estates and Oak of Rosehill and an effective date of 9/1/2017 for High-Meadows subdivision;
- 3. the pass-through gallonage rate increases requested in the application should be approved; and,
- 4. a copy of the approved tariff (attached) be provided to the Applicant.

Pass Through Provision:

For Utilities subject to changes in costs imposed by any non-affiliated provider of purchased water or sewer or a groundwater conservation district having jurisdiction over the Utility, these increases (decreases) shall be passed through as an adjustment to the gallonage charge according to the formula:

AG = G + B/(1-L), Where:

AG = adjusted gallonage charge, rounded to nearest one cent

- G = approved gallonage charge, per 1,000 gallons

B = changed in fee (per 1,000 gallons)

L = water or sewer line loss for preceding 12 months, not to exceed 0.15 (15%)
