

RE: Tariff Control No. 47409 – Application of Woodland Hills Water, LLC to Implement a Pass-Through Rate Change

NOTICE OF APPROVAL

This Notice addresses Woodland Hills Water, LLC's request for approval of a pass-through rate change due to an increase in fees imposed on the utility by the San Jacinto River Authority (SJRA) for the utility's mandatory participation in SJRA's ground water reduction program. The rate increase will affect customers in the Texaba subdivision (Public Water System #1700621). The requested effective date for the pass-through rate change is September 1, 2017. Woodland Hills also requested to change its pass-through provision in its tariff.

On July 26, 2017, Commission Staff recommended that the application be deemed administratively complete and approved as filed, as specified in the pleading and attached memorandum of Emily Sears of the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division. Commission Staff recommended approval of an increase in the pass-through gallonage fee from \$2.76 to \$2.96 per 1,000 gallons for Woodland Hills' customers in the Texaba subdivision, effective September 1, 2017. Commission Staff also recommended approval of Woodland Hills' requested revised pass-through formula, and provided revised tariff pages for Woodland Hills.

Consistent with Commission Staff's recommendation, Woodland Hills' application is sufficient and it is approved. A new pass through rate of \$2.96 per 1,000 gallons for Woodland Hills' customers in the Texaba Subdivision is approved effective September 1, 2017. In addition,

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Woodland Hills' pass-through formula is revised as requested. The approved revised tariff pages for Woodland Hills are attached to this Notice.

SECTION 1.0 -- RATE SCHEDULE (Continued)

PURCHASED WATER AND/OR DISTRICT FEE PASS THROUGH CLAUSE:

The utility may pass on only to those customers served by a system subject to the jurisdiction of any regional water authority and/or any groundwater reduction plan, any increase or decrease in its underground water district pumpage fee or purchased water fee, thirty (30) days after noticing of any change to all effected customers and filing notice with the PUC as required by 16 TAC 24.21 (2). The change per customer shall be calculated as follows:

$$AG = G / (1 - L)$$

Where:

AG = Adjusted gallonage charge, rounded to the nearest one cent

G = gallonage charge by the source supplier

L = water line loss for the preceding 12 months not to exceed 0.15 (15%)
