#### STAFF'S FINAL RECOMMENDATION

**COMES NOW** the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest and files this Final Recommendation and would show the following:

### I. Background

On August 1, 2017, MSEC Enterprises, Inc. (MSEC), Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 12887, requested approval of a pass-through rate increase due to an increase in pumpage, import, and surface water fees imposed on the utility by the San Jacinto River Authority (SJRA) for the utility's mandatory participation in SJRA's ground water reduction program. The requested effective date for the pass-through rate change is September 1, 2017. On August 2, 2017, the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) issued a notice setting August 22, 2017 as the deadline for Staff to file a recommendation on MSEC's application and notice. Thus, this recommendation is timely filed.

### II. Recommendation

Staff has reviewed MSEC's application and notice. As supported by the attached memorandum of Jonathan Ramirez of the Water Utilities Division, Staff finds that the application contains the information necessary to evaluate the application under 16 TAC § \$24.21(b)(2). Additionally, Staff finds that the provided notice meets the requirements of 16 TAC § 24.21(b)(2)(E). Finally, Staff finds that the application meets the requirements for approval under 16 TAC Code § 24.21(b)(2)(A)(vii) and should be approved.

#### III. Conclusion

Staff recommends the issuance of an order deeming the application and notice sufficient and approving the pass-through rate change.

On August 1, 2017, MSEC Enterprises, Inc. (Applicant), Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 12887, requested approval of a pass-through rate increase due to an increase in pumpage, import, and surface water fees imposed on the utility by the San Jacinto River Authority (SJRA) for the utility's mandatory participation in SJRA's ground water reduction program. The requested effective date for the pass-through rate change is September 1, 2017.

The Applicant proposed to increase the surface water pass through rate from \$2.78 to \$2.93 per 1,000 gallons of water usage. Staff confirmed that the applicant has increased its rates using the documents provided with the application. Notice by the applicant was correctly provided to the customers pursuant to 16 Tex. Admin. Code§ 24.21(b)(2)(A)(viii).

Staff has reviewed all the calculations, the notice, and the application and determined that the increase is correct and all notice requirements have been met.

### PURCHASED WATER AND/OR DISTRICT FEE PASS THROUGH CLAUSE:

Changes in fees imposed by any non-affiliated third party water supplier or underground water district having jurisdiction over the Utility shall be passed through as an adjustment to the water gallonage charge according to the following formula:

AG = G + B/(1-L)

Where:

AG = adjusted gallonage charge, rounded to the nearest one cent

G = approved gallonage charge (per 1,000 gallons)

B = change in purchased water/district gallonage charge (per 1,000 gallons)
L = system average line loss for the preceding 12 months not to exceed 0.15
