MISSION:DATA COALITION MOTION TO INTERVENE



The Mission:data Coalition, Inc. (“Mission:data”) hereby files this Motion to Intervene in the above referenced docket. In support of the motion, Mission:data states the following:

1. Mission:data Coalition is a not-for-profit organization focused on advancing policies that improve electric customers’ access to their own energy usage data. The coalition includes over 35 technology companies delivering consumer-focused energy services, representing over \$1 billion/year in energy management business across North America.
