In addition to complying with the Order and directives issued in Project 47522, TriEagle is taking the following voluntary steps to assist customers living in the counties designated as disaster areas by the Governor:

- Late fees have been waived and payment deadlines for residential customers have been extended to October 1, 2017;
- Disconnects for non-payment are suspended through September 30, 2017. We are also notifying customers who received a disconnect notice to disregard this notice;
- Began internal fundraising efforts to collect both money and dry goods which can be directly delivered to those in need in the areas impacted by Hurricane Harvey.

We have sent an e-mail to our customers from whom we have a valid e-mail address and who live in the counties subject to the Governor's Disaster Proclamation. We have also posted this notice to our various social media pages in an effort to make sure that our customers are informed.

TriEagle, and its parent company, Crius Energy, know that people impacted by Harvey have challenges ahead of them. We want to do our part to aid our fellow Texans as we all begin the task of rebuilding from this historic disaster.
