## COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS AND PROPOSED NOTICE

**COMES NOW** the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and in response to Order No. 1, files this Recommendation on Administrative Completeness and Proposed Notice. Staff recommends that the Application be deemed sufficient for further review. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

### I. BACKGROUND

On September 6, 2017, the City of Aubrey (Aubrey) filed an application to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 11234 and sewer CCN No. 20491 and to decertify portions of Mustang Special Utility District's water CCN No. 11856 and sewer CCN No. 20930 in Denton County.

On September 8, 2017, Order No. 1 was issued, establishing a deadline of October 6, 2017, for Staff to file comments on the administrative completeness of the application and proposed notice and propose a procedural schedule. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

### II. ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

As detailed in the attached memorandum from Gregory Charles in the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division, Staff has reviewed the application and supplemental information filed by Aubrey and recommends that it be found administratively complete and accepted for filing.



### III. NOTICE

As detailed in the attached memorandum, Staff recommends that Aubrey be directed to use the attached notice forms to publish notice once each week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Denton County and to:

- 1) Provide notice of the application to the following:
  - a) cities, districts, and neighboring retail public utilities providing the same utility service whose corporate boundaries or certificated service area are located within two miles from the outer boundary of the requested area;
  - b) the county judge of each county that is wholly or partially included in the requested area; and
  - c) each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partially included in the requested area; and
  - d) landowners who own a tract of land that is at least 25 acres and is wholly or partly located in the proposed area to be certified. The landowner information may be obtained from the county appraisal district tax rolls for the county or counties in which the proposed CCN is located; and
  - e) publish notice once each week for two (2) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Denton County.
- 2) Provide notice of the application to the following entities:
  - City of Krugerville
  - Denton County Judge
  - Denton County MUD 6
  - Mustang SUD
  - North Texas Groundwater Conservation District
  - The Lakes FWSD of Denton County
  - Upper Trinity Regional Water District
- 3) Provide an accurate map delineating the requested service area with each individual notice to neighboring utilities, other affected parties, and landowners. Information related to districts including addresses can be obtained by the Applicant from the TCEQ web site located at <a href="http://www14.tceq.texas.gov/iwud/">http://www14.tceq.texas.gov/iwud/</a>.
- 4) File in the docket an affidavit specifying every person and entity to whom notice was provided and the date that the notice was provided within 30 days of the date of the notice. In addition, file the publisher's affidavit for proof of newspaper publication. It is recommended that the Applicant use the attached notices and affidavits to meet these requirements.

### IV. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Staff recommends the application be found administratively complete. Staff therefore proposes the following procedural schedule:

Deadline for Staff to file a recommendation on sufficiency of notice	Within 10 days of Aubrey filing proof of completed notice with the Commission
Deadline to intervene	30 days after notice is issued

### V. CONCLUSION

For the reasons detailed above, Staff recommends that the application be found administratively complete, that Aubrey be directed to provide notice as detailed above and in the attached memorandum, and that the procedural schedule proposed above be adopted.

**Subject: Docket 47587**, Application of City of Aubrey to Amend Water and Sewer Certificates of

Convenience and Necessity (CCNs) in Denton County.

On September 6, 2017, the City of Aubrey (City or Applicant) filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) an application to amend water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 11234 and sewer CCN No. 20491 in Denton County pursuant to pursuant to Texas Water Code Ann. (TWC), §§ 13.242 to 13.250 and the 16 Tex. Admin Code (TAC) §§ 24.101 to 24.107. The requested area includes approximately 172 acres and 1 current customer.

A Staff review of the information found that it is sufficient in the required application and mapping information. Therefore, Staff recommends that the application be deemed sufficient for filing and found administratively complete. Staff further recommends the Applicant be ordered to do the following:

- 1) Provide notice of the application to the following:
  - a) cities, districts, and neighboring retail public utilities providing the same utility service whose corporate boundaries or certificated service area are located within two miles from the outer boundary of the requested area;
  - b) the county judge of each county that is wholly or partially included in the requested area; and
  - c) each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partially included in the requested area; and
  - d) landowners who own a tract of land that is at least 25 acres and is wholly or partly located in the proposed area to be certified. The landowner information may be obtained from the county appraisal district tax rolls for the county or counties in which the proposed CCN is located; and
  - e) publish notice once each week for two (2) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Denton County.
- 2) Provide notice of the application to the following entities:
  - City of Krugerville
  - Denton County Judge
  - Denton County MUD 6
  - Mustang SUD
  - North Texas Groundwater Conservation District
  - The Lakes FWSD of Denton County

The City of Aubrey filed an application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas to amend its Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) Nos. 11234 and 20930 for the provision of water and sewer service in Denton County.

The requested area is located approximately 1 mile south-southeast of downtown Aubrey, TX, and is generally bounded on the north by Pine Ridge Lane; on the east by a line approx. 1 mile east of US 377; on the south by Woodland Drive; and on the west by US 377.

The total area being requested includes approximately 172 acres and serves 1 current customer.

The requested area overlaps the boundaries of <u>Mustang SUD</u>. If <u>Mustang SUD</u> does not request a public hearing, the Commission shall determine that <u>Mustang SUD</u> is consenting to the City of Aubrey's request to provide retail water and sewer utility in the requested area.

If a public hearing is requested, the Commission will not issue the CCN and will forward the application to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH) for a hearing. If no settlement is reached and an evidentiary hearing is held, SOAH will submit a recommendation to the Commission for final decision. If an evidentiary hearing is held, it will be a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.

If you are a landowner with a tract of land at least 25 acres or more, that is partially or wholly located within the proposed service area, you may request to be excluded from the proposed service area (or "opt out") by providing written notice to the Commission within (30) days from the date that notice was provided by the applicant. All requests to opt out of the requested service area must include a large scale map and a metes and bounds description of the tract of land.

Persons who meet the requirements to opt out, and wish to request this option should file the required documents with the:
