APPLICATION OF CYPRESSWOOD ESTATES WATER SYSTEM FOR A PASS-THROUGH RATE CHANGE

ORDER APPROVING INTERIM RATE AND PROVIDING FURTHER INSTRUCTION

I. Background

A. The Application

This Order addresses the September 20, 2017 application of Cypresswood Estates Water System for approval of a pass-through rate increase due to an increase in fees imposed on the utility by the San Jacinto River Authority (SJRA) for the utility's participation in SJRA's Groundwater Reduction Plan. The pass-through pumpage fee charged by SJRA of \$2.64 per 1,000 gallons, was effective September 1, 2017. Cypresswood proposed to pass through the annual cost, based on historical gallons pumped from the well and the new effective rate, as a flat monthly rate of \$26.36 per connection.

B. Remand Order

Commission Staff recommended that Cypresswood be denied a pass-through rate change. but in the alternative, be approved to implement a \$26.36 surcharge per connection per month effective September 1, 2017 and ending August 31, 2018. An order with Commission Staff's recommendation was considered by the Commission at the January 25, 2018 Open Meeting. The Commission voted to remand the docket to the administrative law judge for the ALJ to order an interim rate in the amount of \$26.36 per month beginning on the next billing for the pass-through of the SJRA fee. The Commission also ordered the ALJ to instruct the parties to take steps to move Cypresswood to a more fiscally viable state.

In accordance with the January 26, 2018 Order Remanding Proceeding to ALJ, an interim pass-through rate in the amount of \$26.36 per connection per month, effective for Cypresswood's next billing cycle, is approved. Tariff pages for Cypresswood are attached to this Order.

II. Further Instruction

In accordance with the order on remand, the parties are ordered to determine the total amount due to the SJRA, including past-due payments, penalties, and any interest owed. Cypresswood is encouraged to work with SJRA on minimizing the penalties and interest it owes and Commission Staff should provide as much assistance as they are able. When the total amount owed has been calculated, an appropriate rate should be proposed to provide for the ongoing fees and the recovery of all arrears over a reasonable period of time that takes into account the burden on Cypresswood's customers. Once that proposed rate has been determined, Cypresswood will be required to issue a new notice to their customers of this enhanced rate to recover the entirety of its debt to SJRA. No later than February 15, 2018, the parties shall propose a procedural schedule for further processing of this docket.
