# COMMISSION STAFF'S SUPPLEMENTAL RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS AND PROPOSED NOTICE

**COMES NOW** the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and in response to Order No. 6, files this Supplemental Recommendation on Administrative Completeness and Proposed Notice. Staff recommends that the application be deemed sufficient for further review. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

#### I. BACKGROUND

On October 16, 2017, Windthorst Water Supply Corporation (Windthorst) filed an application to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 11355 in Archer County. The service area being requested includes 3 separate areas totaling approximately 368 acres, with a total of 3 current customers.

On May 3, 2018, the Commission administrative law judge (ALJ) issued Order No. 6, finding that Windthorst's application remains deficient and requiring Windthorst to file a supplement by May 17, 2018. Windthorst filed a supplement to their application on May 17, 2018. Order No. 6 also required Staff to file a supplemental recommendation regarding the administrative completeness of the application by June 4, 2018. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

#### II. ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

As further detailed in the attached memorandum of Jolie Mathis in the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division, Staff has reviewed the application and recommends that it be found administratively complete and accepted for filing.

#### III. NOTICE

As detailed in the attached memorandum, Staff recommends that Windthorst proceed with providing public notice and be directed to use the attached forms to provide such notice to the following persons, political subdivisions and other entities:

- a. cities, districts, and neighboring retail public utilities providing the same utility service whose corporate boundaries or certificated service area are located within two miles from the outer boundary of the requested area;
- b. the county judge of each county that is wholly or partially included in the requested area:
- c. each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partially included in the requested area; and
- d. landowners who own a tract of land that is at least 25 acres and is wholly or partly located in the requested area to be certified. The landowner information may be obtained from the county appraisal district tax rolls for the county or counties in which the requested area is located;
- e. any affected customers, and other affected parties in the requested area; and
- f. publish notice once each week for two (2) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Archer County.

In addition, Staff recommends that Windthorst provide correct notice of the application to the following entities:

- City of Archer City
- Red River Authority of Texas
- Archer County
- 1) Provide an accurate map delineating the requested area with each individual notice to neighboring utilities, other affected parties, landowners and customers. Information related to districts including addresses can be obtained by Windthorst from the TCEQ's web site located at <a href="http://www14.tceq.texas.gov/iwud/">http://www14.tceq.texas.gov/iwud/</a>
- 2) Within 30 days of the date of the notice, file in the docket a map and copy of notice along with an affidavit specifying every person and entity to whom notice was provided, the date that the notice was provided, and the publisher's affidavit for proof of newspaper publication. It is recommended that Windthorst use the attached notices and affidavits to meet these requirements.

#### IV. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Staff proposes the following procedural schedule:

Deadline for Windthorst to file with the Commission signed affidavits that the notice was given along with a copy of the notice sent to the affected parties and published in a newspaper of general circulation	July 19, 2018
Deadline for Staff to file a recommendation on sufficiency of notice and propose a supplemental procedural schedule	Within 10 days of Windthorst filing proof of completed notice with the Commission
Deadline to intervene	30 days after notice is issued

### V. CONCLUSION

For the reasons discussed above, Staff recommends that the application be found administratively complete, that Windthorst be directed to provide notice as detailed above and in the attached memorandum, and that the procedural schedule be adopted.

On October 16, 2017, Windthorst Water Supply Corporation (Windthorst WSC or Applicant) filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) an application to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 11355 in Archer County, Texas pursuant to Texas Water Code Ann. (TWC) §§ 13.242 to 13.250 and the 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §§ 24.101 to 24.107.

Staff has reviewed the additional information filed by the Applicant on May 17, 2018, and recommends that the application be deemed sufficient for filing and administratively complete. Staff further recommends the Applicant be ordered to do the following:

- 1) Provide notice of the application to the following:
  - a) cities, districts, and neighboring retail public utilities providing the same utility service whose corporate boundaries or certificated service area are located within two miles from the outer boundary of the requested area;
  - b) the county judge of each county that is wholly or partially included in the requested area;
  - c) each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partially included in the requested area; and
  - d) landowners who own a tract of land that is at least 25 acres and is wholly or partly located in the requested area to be certified. The landowner information may be obtained from the county appraisal district tax rolls for the county or counties in which the requested area is located;
  - e) any affected customers, and other affected parties in the requested area; and
  - f) publish notice once each week for two (2) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Archer County.
- 2) Provide correct notice of the application to the following entities:
  - City of Archer City
  - Red River Authority of Texas
  - Archer County
- 3) Provide an accurate map delineating the requested area with each individual notice to neighboring utilities, other affected parties, landowners and customers. Information related to districts including addresses can be obtained by the Applicant from the TCEQ's web site located at <a href="http://www14.tceq.texas.gov/iwud/">http://www14.tceq.texas.gov/iwud/</a>

4) File in the docket a map and copy of notice along with an affidavit specifying every person and entity to whom notice was provided, the date that the notice was provided, and the publisher's affidavit for proof of newspaper publication, within 30 days of the date of notice. It is recommended that the Applicant use the attached notices and affidavits to meet these requirements.

The deadline for intervention in the proceeding is (30 days from the mailing or publication of notice, whichever occurs later, unless otherwise provided by the presiding officer). You must send a letter requesting intervention to the commission which is received by that date.

If a valid public hearing is requested, the Commission will forward the application to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH) for a hearing. If no settlement is reached and an evidentiary hearing is held, SOAH will submit a recommendation to the Commission for a final decision. An evidentiary hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.

A landowner with a tract of land at least 25 acres or more, that is partially or wholly located within the requested area, may file a written request with the Commission to be excluded from the requested area ("opt out") within (30) days from the date that notice was provided by the Utility. All opt out requests must include a large scale map and a metes and bounds description of the landowner's tract of land.

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
