



# COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS AND PROPOSED NOTICE

COMES NOW the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and in response to Order No. 1, files this Recommendation on Administrative Completeness and Proposed Notice. Staff recommends that the application be deemed deficient and that the applicant be ordered to address the identified deficiencies. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

#### I. BACKGROUND

On October 16, 2017, Windthorst Water Supply Corporation (Windthorst) filed an application to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 11355 in Archer County.

On October 19, 2017, Order No. 1 was issued, establishing a deadline of November 15, 2017, for Staff to file comments on the administrative completeness of the application and proposed notice and propose a procedural schedule. This pleading is therefore timely filed.

#### II. ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

As detailed in the attached memorandum from Jolie Mathis in the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division, Staff has reviewed the application and recommends that it be found administratively incomplete. Specifically, Staff has identified deficiencies in the mapping and financial information submitted. Staff recommends that Windthorst submit additional mapping and financial information, as further detailed in the attached memorandum. Staff also notes that Windthorst should not issue notice until the application is found administratively complete.



III. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

In accordance with the recommendation that the application be found administratively

incomplete, Staff recommends that a deadline of December 15, 2017, be established for

Windthorst to supplement its application. Staff further recommends that a deadline of January 12,

2018, be established for Staff to review Windthorst's supplemental information and make a

supplemental recommendation on the administrative completeness of the application.

IV. **CONCLUSION** 

For the reasons discussed above, Staff respectfully recommends that the application be

found administratively incomplete. Staff further recommends that the procedural schedule

proposed above be adopted for further processing of this docket.

On October 16, 2017, Windthorst Water Supply Corporation (Applicant or Windthorst WSC) filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) an application to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 11355 in Archer County, Texas pursuant to Texas Water Code Ann. (TWC), §§ 13.242 to 13.250 and 16 Tex. Admin Code (TAC) §§ 24.101 to 24.107.

Staff has reviewed the information provided by the Applicant and recommends the application be deemed administratively incomplete and not accepted for filing due to the deficiencies detailed below:

#### **Mapping Content:**

The mapping documentation filed in the application is deficient. The Applicant did not file a detailed map and the general location was not legible or to scale. The written descriptions provided for the requested areas are not considered metes and bounds surveys sealed or embossed by either a licensed state surveyor or a registered professional land surveyor. Therefore, Staff is unable to determine the accurate location for the requested areas the Applicant is seeking to amend in this application.

The Applicant must file the following items to resolve the mapping deficiencies:

- A revised general location map identifying the requested area(s) in reference to the nearest county boundary, city, or town.
- A detailed map identifying the requested area(s) in reference to verifiable man-made and natural landmarks, such as roads, rivers, and railroads.
- Digital mapping data for the requested area(s), as a single polygon record, in shapefile (SHP) format, georeferenced in either NAD83 Texas Statewide Mapping System (Meters) or NAD83 Texas State Plane Coordinate System (US Feet); OR metes and bounds survey sealed or embossed by either a licensed state surveyor or a registered professional land surveyor.

## Financial Information:

The audited financial statements filed in this application did not include the Independent Auditor's Report.

The Applicant must file the following items to resolve the financial deficiencies:

- A copy of the Independent Auditor's Report marked as page 1 and the auditor's management letter if issued separately from the audited financial statements, for the Year Ended December 31, 2016.
- Financial statement projections for the years 2017, 2018 and 2019 to complete the operations test.
