#### NOTICE OF APPROVAL

This Notice addresses the petition of Mike Hopkins, executor of the estate of Herman H. Hopkins (Mr. Hopkins) for expedited release from the Bolivar Water Supply Corporation's water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) No. 11257, under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.254(a-5)<sup>1</sup> and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.113(l). Commission Staff recommended approval of Mr. Hopkins's petition. Consistent with Commission Staff's recommendation, the petition is approved.

The Commission adopts the following findings of fact and conclusions of law:

#### I. Findings of Fact

#### Procedural History, Description and Background

- On September 22, 2017, Mr. Hopkins filed a petition to amend Bolivar WSC's water CCN
  No. 11257 in Denton County by expedited release.
- 2. On September 25, 2017, Order No. 1 was issued setting a deadline for comments on the administrative completeness of the petition and notice.
- 3. On November 14, 2017, an affidavit of Mike Hopkins was filed to support the petition.
- 4. On November 27, 2017, Commission Staff recommended that the petition and notice be deemed administratively complete.

- 5. On December 1, 2017, Order No. 3 was issued finding the petition administratively complete and sufficient.
- 6. On December 15, 2017, Commission Staff recommended (1) approval of the petition (2) that no property would be rendered useless or valueless by the decertification, and (3) that no compensation proceeding is necessary. Commission Staff provided a certificate and service area map.
- 7. The final map and CCN certificate discussed in Finding of Fact No. 6 are attached to this Notice.
- 8. No protests, motions to intervene, or request for hearing were filed.

#### Notice

- 9. Mr. Hopkins filed a signed written statement that on September 22, 2017 a copy of the petition was provided to Bolivar WSC.
- 10. Notice of the petition was published in the *Texas Register* on October 6, 2017.

#### Project Description

- 11. The approximately 60.093-acre tract of land Mr. Hopkins seeks to have released from Bolivar WSC's water CCN No. 11257 is owned by Mr. Hopkins and is situated in Denton County, a qualifying county under TWC § 13.254(a-5) and TAC § 24.113(r).
- 12. The area Mr. Hopkins seeks to have decertified from water CCN No. 11257 is at least 25 acres and is not receiving water service.
- 13. Commission Staff recommended approval of the release of Mr. Hopkins's tract located within Bolivar WSC's water CCN No. 11257.

#### Water Service

- 14. The 60.093-acre tract is not receiving water service from Bolivar WSC, as that term has been defined by the Courts.
- 15. The 60.093-acre tract is not receiving actual water service from Bolivar WSC, or any other water service provider.

#### II. Conclusions of Law

- 1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this petition under TWC §§ 13.041 and 13.254(a-5).
- 2. Notice of the petition was provided in compliance with 16 TAC § 24.113(l)(3)(A)(vi) and 16 TAC §§ 22.54 and 22.55.
- 3. Denton County is a qualifying county under TWC § 13.254(a-5) and 16 TAC § 24.113(l)(2)(D).
- 4. The 60.093-acre tract of land to be decertified under TWC § 13.254(a-5) is owned by Mr. Hopkins, is located in a qualifying county, is at least 25 acres in size, and is not receiving water service from Bolivar WSC.
- 5. Bolivar WSC did not intervene in this proceeding, therefore under 16 TAC § 24.113(n)(3), Bolivar WSC had no property rendered useless or valueless as a result of the requested decertification.
- 6. No property of Bolivar WSC was rendered useless or valueless by the decertification, therefore, under TWC § 13.254(d)-(g), no compensation is owed to Bolivar WSC.
- 7. Because no compensation is owed, under TWC § 13.254(d)-(g), a retail public utility may render retail water service directly or indirectly to the public in the decertified area without providing compensation to Bolivar WSC.
- 8. Mr. Hopkins is entitled to approval of the petition, having sufficiently satisfied the requirements of TWC § 13.254(a-5) and 16 TAC § 24.113(l) by adequately demonstrating ownership of a tract of land that is at least 25 acres, located in a qualifying county, and is not receiving water service.
- 9. Under TWC § 13.257(r), Bolivar WSC is required to record a certified copy of the approved certificate and map, along with a boundary description of the service area, in the real property records of each county in which the service area or a portion of the service area is located, and submit to the Commission evidence of the recording.
- 10. The notice requirements in 16 TAC §22.35 have been met in this proceeding.

#### III. Ordering Paragraphs

In accordance with these findings of fact and conclusions of law, the Commission issues the following orders:

- 1. The petition is approved.
- 2. The 60.093-acre tract of land is removed from Bolivar WSC's water CCN No. 11257.
- 3. Bolivar WSC's water CCN No. 11257 is amended in accordance with this Notice.
- 4. The Commission's official service-area boundary maps for Bolivar WSC shall reflect this change, as shown in the attached map.
- 5. A copy of Bolivar WSC's amended water CCN No. 11257 is attached to this Notice.
- 6. Bolivar WSC shall comply with the recording requirements of TWC § 13.257(r) and (s) for the area in Denton County affected by the petition and submit to the Commission evidence of the recording no later than 31 days after receipt of this Notice.
- 7. All other motions and any other requests for general or specific relief, if not expressly granted, are denied.
