COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON NOTICE

COMES NOW the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and files this Recommendation on Notice. Staff recommends that Hutto provide notice as detailed below and in the attached memorandum. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

I. BACKGROUND

On November 21, 2017, the City of Hutto (Hutto) filed an application to amend sewer certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) No. 20122 in Williamson County. The total area being requested included approximately 15,648 acres and served zero current customers. On February 7, 2018, Hutto filed updated maps to modify its requested service area. The revised requested service area includes approximately 14,250 acres and serves zero current customers.

Order No. 3, issued on February 7, 2018, required Staff to file a recommendation on notice by February 21, 2018. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

II. NOTICE

Corrected notice of the application was published in the *Texas Register* on January 26, 2018 to clarify that Hutto seeks to modify a sewer CCN, not a water CCN.¹ As detailed in the attached memorandum from Gregory Charles in the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division, Staff has prepared new notice for Hutto to use based on the updated maps filed on February 7, 2018. Staff recommends that Hutto publish correct notice once each week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Williamson County. Staff also recommends that Hutto provide correct notice of the application to the following:

- cities, districts, and neighboring retail public utilities providing the same utility service whose corporate boundaries or certificated service area are located within two miles from the outer boundary of the requested area;
- the county judge of each county that is wholly or partially included in the requested area;
- each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partially included in the requested area; and
- landowners who own a tract of land that is at least 25 acres and is wholly or partly located in the requested area to be certified. The landowner information may be obtained from the county appraisal district tax rolls for the county or counties in which the requested area is located; and
- affected customers.

Staff also recommends that Hutto also provide correct notice of the application to the following entities:

Hutto should provide an accurate map delineating the requested service area with each individual notice to neighboring utilities, other affected parties, and landowners. Information related to districts including addresses can be obtained by Hutto from the TCEQ web site located at http://www14.tceq.texas.gov/iwud/.

Hutto should also file in the docket an affidavit specifying every person and entity to whom notice was provided and the date that the notice was provided by the April 6, 2018 deadline established by Order No. 3. In addition, Hutto should file the publisher's affidavit for proof of newspaper publication. It is recommended that Hutto use the attached notices and affidavits to meet these requirements.

III. CONCLUSION

For the reasons detailed above, Staff recommends that Hutto be directed to provide notice as detailed above and in the attached memorandum.

On November 21, 2017, the City of Hutto (Applicant or City) filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) an application to amend its sewer Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 20122 in Williamson County, Texas, pursuant to Texas Water Code Ann. §§ 13.242-.250 (TWC) and the 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §§ 24.101-.107.

On February 5, 2017, the Applicant filed a request for an extension of time and adoption of a revised procedural schedule. The motion stated the Applicant prematurely sent out notices that did not correspond with the notices prepared by Commission staff and that the Applicant's requested service had changed. On February 7, 2018, the Applicant filed mapping information for the revised requested area. Staff has reviewed the information and finds that it meets the required mapping criteria. Staff recommends the following:

- 1) Provide notice of the application to the following:
 - a. cities, districts, and neighboring retail public utilities providing the same utility service whose corporate boundaries or certificated service area are located within two miles from the outer boundary of the requested area;
 - b. the county judge of each county that is wholly or partially included in the requested area;
 - c. each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partially included in the requested area; and
 - d. landowners who own a tract of land that is at least 25 acres and is wholly or partly located in the requested area to be certified. The landowner information may be obtained from the county appraisal district tax rolls for the county or counties in which the requested area is located; and
 - e. affected customers
 - f. publish notice once each week for two (2) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Williamson County.

You must send a letter requesting intervention to the commission which is received by that date.

If a public hearing is requested, the Commission will not issue the CCN and will forward the application to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH) for a hearing. If no settlement is reached and an evidentiary hearing is held, SOAH will submit a recommendation to the Commission for final decision. If an evidentiary hearing is held, it will be a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.

If you are a landowner with a tract of land at least 25 acres or more, that is partially or wholly located within the proposed service area, you may request to be excluded from the proposed service area (or "opt out") by providing written notice to the Commission within (30) days from the date that notice was provided by the applicant. All requests to opt out of the requested service area must include a large scale map and a metes and bounds description of the tract of land.

If you have already filed an opt out request in this docket, you do not need to refile your request so long as it included everything required by 16 TAC § 24.102(h)(1): (A) the commission docket number and CCN number; (B) the total acreage of the tract of land subject to the landowner's opt out request; and (C) a metes and bounds survey for the tract of land subject to the landowner's opt out request, that is

sealed or embossed by either a licensed state land surveyor or registered professional land surveyor.
