#### DIRECT TESTIMONY OF DEBBIE McCLANAHAN

- 1 Q. Please state your name and business address.
- 2 A. My name is Debbie McClanahan. My business address is 466 Chaparral Rd, Victoria,
- 3 Texas, 77905.
- 4 Q. On whose behalf are you testifying in this proceeding?
- 5 A. I am filing testimony on behalf of the South Central Calhoun County Water Control and
- 6 Improvement District No. 1 ("District").
- 7 Q. Who are you employed by?
- 8 A. Balanced Books.
- 9 O. What is your title at Balanced Books?
- 10 A. Owner, Certified QuickBooks ProAdvisor and Principal Bookkeeper.
- 11 Q. What are your job responsibilities as Principal Bookkeeper?
- 12 A. I provide expert assistance to various non-profits and businesses in the areas of
- bookkeeping, billing, payroll and various other services to keep their businesses
- profitable and run more efficiently.
- 15 Q. How many years of experience do you have in the bookkeeping business?
- 16 A. I have over 40 years' experience in bookkeeping and consulting small businesses to
- become more profitable and run more efficiently.

- 1 Q. What is your education level?
- 2 A. I have about 2 years of local college.
- 3 Q. What certifications do you hold?
- 4 A. I am a Certified Bookkeeper and QuickBooks ProAdvisor.
- 5 Q. Do you have a current list of professional qualifications?
- 6 A. Yes. DISTRICT EXH. 7 is an accurate copy of the current qualifications of my firm
- 7 Balanced Books.
- 8 [DISTRICT OFFERS DISTRICT EXH. 7]
- 9 Q. When were you first retained by the District?
- 10 A. I was retained in May of 2017.
- 11 Q. Please explain the methodology you employed to review the District's rates?
- 12 A. The financial statements were prepared using GAAP (Generally Accepted Accounting
- 13 Principles).
- 14 Q. When did you first review the District's rates?
- 15 A. In May of 2017, the District asked me to review the District's financials in the course of
- my work as the bookkeeper. I included the August 2017 and September 2017 Profit and
- Loss Statements from my review with my testimony as DISTRICT EXHs. 8 and 9.
- 18 [DISTRICT OFFERS DISTRICT EXHs. 8 and 9]
- 19 Q. Can you describe the scope of your review of the District's financials and the sewer
- 20 rates at issue in this proceeding?
- 21 A. Yes. After reviewing the District's financials, I reviewed the District's budget, revenue,
- and expenses which included operation and maintenance expenses. I recommended to
- 23 the board at their May meeting that the District needed to raise the income or lower

1		expenses. Their revenue was not enough to cover their operation expenses or future
2		repairs and maintenance.
3	Q.	In your opinion as the District's Bookkeeper, are the District's current rates
4		adequate to produce revenues on an ongoing basis sufficient to maintain the
5		financial integrity of the District?
6	A.	The District's current rates are, at best, minimally adequate to cover the reasonable and
7		necessary expenses of operating of the system.
8	Q.	In your opinion, are the current rates at issue in this proceeding reasonable and are
9		the expenses those rates are based on necessary?
10	A.	The rates adopted by the District are below the rates charged by several cities surveyed
11		by the Texas Municipal League (TML) in 2017 and are reasonable. In my experience,
12		the District's expenses appear to be necessary to run the system. I provided the TML
13		survey of rates, attached to my testimony as DISTRICT EXH. 10.
14	[DIS	TRICT OFFERS DISTRICT EXH. 10]
15	Q.	On what do you base your opinion of the reasonableness of the District's adopted
16		rates?
17	A.	I have analyzed the revenue requirements of the sewer system and my analysis shows that
18		the revenue needed to maintain the systems was minimally met in 2017 with the adopted
19		rates. Based on my review of the 2017 financials, a rate increase to cover necessary
20		expenses was required for the District to continue operation.
21	Q.	How much do you anticipate billing the District for your work on the rate appeal?
22	A.	I plan to bill the District \$450.00 for preparation of this testimony and I may bill more

before this case is final.

- 1 Q. Are your charges reasonable for the analysis and consultation that you have
- 2 provided to the District?
- 3 A. Yes. These amounts are below my normal rate that I customarily charge. This
- 4 consultation is necessary for the defense of the District's rates in this appeal.
- 5 Q. Are DISTRICT EXS. 6 10 an accurate representation of what they purport to be?
- 6 A. Yes.
- 7 Q. Does this conclude your pre-filed direct testimony?
- 8 A. Yes, but I reserve the right to amend this testimony as needed prior to the hearing.

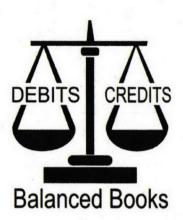
