#### NOTICE OF APPROVAL

**Background.** In Docket No. 45486,<sup>1</sup> the Commission approved a request by MSEC Enterprises, Inc. for a pass-through rate of \$2.58 for 2016 to recover fees imposed on the utility by the San Jacinto River Authority (SJRA). At that point, MSEC had transitioned to surface water as a partial water source, so the pass-through rate resulted from a blend of groundwater pumpage fees and surface water gallonage charges. The blended rate included some estimates, so MSEC was ordered to true-up the rate in a report due by the end of March 2017, and the order allowed for the true-up to be filed with a new pass-through request.

Five months later in Docket No. 46258, MSEC filed a request to increase the pass-through rate to \$2.78, as SJRA had increased its fees yet again. However, rather than include a true-up report in the request, MSEC requested that the true-up of the \$2.58 rate be combined with any true-up of the \$2.78 rate. The Commission approved the request in September 2016 and ordered MSEC to true-up the rate in a report due by the end of November 2017.

In Docket No. 47465,<sup>3</sup> MSEC requested and was approved to increase the pass-through rate to \$2.93, effective September 1, 2017.

<u>True-Up.</u> This Order addresses MSEC's True-Up Report ordered in Tariff Control No. 46258.

On January 26, 2018, Commission Staff recommended the application be deemed sufficient and approved, consistent with the pleading and memorandum of Patricia Garcia in the

Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division. Ms. Garcia recommended that MSEC's authorized pass-through rate be reduced by \$0.18 per 1,000 gallons to address the over-collection from customers during the True-Up Period. Using the Commission approved tariff formula, MSEC proposed to issue the over-collection as a credit back to its customers by lowering the pass-through rate for the next year and decreasing the pass-through rate for the SJRA Surface Water Fee from \$2.93 per 1,000 gallons to \$2.75 per 1,000 gallons. Commission Staff found the calculations appropriate.

Consistent with Staff's recommendation, MSEC's application and notice are deemed sufficient. MSEC's request to decrease the pass-through rate of \$2.93 to \$2.75 per 1.000 gallons is approved. The approved tariff pages are attached.

## PURCHASED WATER AND/OR DISTRICT FEE PASS THROUGH CLAUSE:

Changes in fees imposed by any non-affiliated third party water supplier or underground water district having jurisdiction over the Utility shall be passed through as an adjustment to the water gallonage charge according to the following formula:

AG = G + B/(1-L)

Where:

AG = adjusted gallonage charge, rounded to the nearest one cent

G = approved gallonage charge (per 1,000 gallons)

B = change in purchased water/district gallonage charge (per 1,000 gallons)
L = system average line loss for the preceding 12 months not to exceed 0.15
