COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON FINAL DISPOSITION

COMES NOW the Commission Staff (Staff) of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission), representing the public interest, and files this response to Order No. 2, Staff's Recommendation on Final Disposition. Staff recommends that the petition be approved. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

I. BACKGROUND

On January 2, 2018, Primewood Investments, L.P. (Primewood) filed a petition with the Commission for streamlined expedited release (SER) of approximately 12 acres from Aqua Texas Inc.'s (Aqua Texas) water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) No. 13203 and approximately 18 acres from sewer CCN No. 21065 in Montgomery County, Texas. The petition was filed pursuant to Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.254(a-5) and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.113(l). In the petition, Primewood asserted that it owns approximately 1,295 acres in Montgomery County (the Property), the certificated portions of which it seeks to have released from Aqua Texas's water and sewer CCNs.¹ Primewood also asserts that the Property is not receiving water or sewer service from Aqua Texas and that Primewood has never requested such service.²

On February 5, 2018, the Commission administrative law judge (ALJ) issued Order No. 2, finding Primewood's petition administratively complete and requiring Staff to file a recommendation on final disposition by February 19, 2018. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

II. PETITION APPROVAL RECOMMENDATION

As further detailed in the attached memorandum of Jolie Mathis of the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division, Staff has reviewed Primewood's petition and recommends that the petition meets the requirements of TWC § 13.254(a-5) and 16 TAC § 24.113(l) and therefore should be granted. Specifically, Staff verified the location, acreage, and ownership of the area subject to the petition for release. Furthermore, Primewood attested that the Property is not receiving water or sewer service.

Staff did not identify any property that would be rendered useless or valueless by the decertification. Pursuant to 16 TAC § 24.113(n)(3), there is a rebuttable presumption that there is no useless or valueless property if the current CCN holder fails to intervene. The current CCN holder in this case, Aqua Texas, did not intervene. Therefore, Staff recommends that no property be found to be useless or valueless and, accordingly, that no compensation proceeding is necessary. In accordance with Staff's recommendation, the proposed final maps and certificates are attached to this filing.

III. CONCLUSION

For the reasons stated above, Staff respectfully recommends that the petition be granted and that no compensation proceeding is necessary because no property will be rendered useless or valueless by the granting of the petition.

On January 2, 2018, Primewood Investments, LP (Primewood or Petitioner) filed an application for streamlined expedited release from Aqua Texas, Inc.'s (Aqua) water and sewer Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) Nos. 13203 and 21065 in Montgomery County. The petition was filed under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.254(a-5) and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.113(l). The Petitioner asserts that the land is at least 25 contiguous acres, is not receiving water or sewer service, and is located in Montgomery County, which is a qualifying county.

The Petitioner submitted adequate maps delineating the requested area for expedited release with enough detail to confirm the accurate positioning of their digital data pursuant to 16 TAC §§ 24.113(m) and 24.119. The map and digital data are sufficient to determine the locations of the requested release areas within Aqua's certificated areas. Mapping Staff was able to confirm the acreage of the subject properties and determined that the requested areas are located within the subject property. Furthermore, the Petitioner provided warranty deeds confirming the Petitioner's ownership of the tracts of land within the subject property. In addition, the Petitioner submitted a sworn affidavit attesting that the property was not receiving water or sewer service from the CCN holder. The area being requested for release is approximately 12 acres from water CCN No. 13203 and approximately 18 acres from sewer CCN No. 21065.

The petition also included a statement indicating that a copy of the petition was sent via certified mail to Aqua on the date the petition was filed with the Commission in accordance with the requirement of 16 TAC § 24.113(l)(3)(A)(vi).

Aqua Texas, Inc. did not request to intervene. Pursuant to 16 TAC § 24.113(n)(3), there is a rebuttable presumption that there is no useless or valueless property if the current CCN holder fails to intervene. Therefore, Staff recommends that there is no useless or valueless property. Staff accordingly recommends that a compensation proceeding is not necessary if the Commission determines that there is no useless or valueless property, pursuant to 16 TAC § 24.113(n)(7).


On February 5, 2018, Order No. 2 deemed the petition administratively complete, starting the 60 day determination period pursuant to 16 TAC § 24.113(l)(3)(5). The deadline for the Commission to issue a decision is therefore April 6, 2018. The procedural schedule in Order No. 2 required Staff's recommendation on final disposition to be filed by February 19, 2018, and furthermore set February 26, 2018 as the deadline for the Petitioner's response. In accordance with Chapter 13 of the Texas Water Code and Title 16, Chapter 24 of the Texas Administrative Code, the Petitioner has met the Commission's requirements to allow for the streamlined expedited release of the requested area from Aqua's CCN Nos. 13203 and 21065. Therefore, Staff recommends approval of the petition. Enclosed is a final map and certificate for Commission approval.

Water and Sewer Release Area Maps


