## ORDER NO. 2 FINDING THE APPLICATION INCOMPLETE AND DEFICIENT; AND ESTABLISHING AN OPPORTUNITY TO CURE

This Order addresses Commission Staff's February 16. 2018, recommendation that the City of Dripping Spring's application is not administratively complete because it contains material deficiencies, as specifically described in the memorandum of Emily Sears of the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division.

Consistent with Commission Staff's recommendation, the application is incomplete and deficient. Under 16 Texas Administrative Code § 24.8(d), applications are not considered filed until a determination of administrative completeness is made; thus, at this time the application is not considered filed with the Commission.

On or before March 20, 2018, Dripping Springs shall amend the application to cure the deficiencies described by Commission Staff. Processing of the application cannot proceed until the requested items are received and reviewed. Notice shall not be issued until the application is administratively complete.

On or before April 13, 2018, Commission Staff shall file a supplemental recommendation regarding administrative completeness, along with a proposed procedural schedule, if appropriate.
