COMMISSION STAFF'S SUPPLEMENTAL RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS AND PROPOSED NOTICE

COMES NOW the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and in response to Order No. 2, files this Supplemental Recommendation on Administrative Completeness and Proposed Notice. Staff recommends that the application be deemed sufficient for further review. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

I. BACKGROUND

On February 7, 2018, Quadvest L.P. (Quadvest) filed an application to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 11612 and sewer CCN No. 20952 in Fort Bend County. The total area being requested includes approximately one hundred eight (108) acres and zero (0) current customers.

On March 12, 2018, Order No. 2 was issued establishing a deadline of April 23, 2018, for Staff to file a supplemental recommendation on the administrative completeness of the application and to propose a procedural schedule for further processing of the application. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

II. ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

As further detailed in the attached memorandum of Fred Bednarski in the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division, Staff has reviewed the application and recommends that it be found administratively complete and accepted for filing.

III. NOTICE

As detailed in the attached memorandum, Staff recommends that Quadvest proceed with providing public notice and be directed to use the attached forms to provide such notice to the following persons, political subdivisions and other entities:

- a. cities, districts, and neighboring retail public utilities providing the same utility service whose corporate boundaries or certificated service area are located within two miles from the outer boundary of the requested area;
- b. the county judge of each county that is wholly or partially included in the requested area;
- c. each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partially included in the requested area;
- d. affected customers; and
- e. publish notice once a week for two (2) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Fort Bend County.

In addition, Staff recommends that Quadvest provide correct notice of the application to the following entities:

- Village of Fairchilds
- Brazos River Authority
- Fort Bend County Drainage District
- Fort Bend Subsidence District
- Fort Bend County Judge

Along with each individual notice, Staff recommends that Quadvest provide an accurate map delineating the requested service area. Additionally, Staff recommends that Quadvest file in the docket an affidavit specifying every person and entity to whom notice was provided and the date that such notice was provided within thirty (30) days of the date of the notice. Further, Staff recommends that Quadvest file the publisher's affidavit for proof of newspaper publication. It is recommended that Quadvest use the attached notices and affidavits to meet these requirements.

IV. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Staff proposes the following procedural schedule:

Deadline for Quadvest to file with the Commission signed affidavits that the notice was given along with a copy of the notice sent to the affected parties and published in a newspaper of general circulation	June 7, 2018
Deadline for Staff to file a recommendation on sufficiency of notice and propose a supplemental procedural schedule	Within ten (10) days of Quadvest filing proof of completed notice with the Commission
Deadline to intervene	Thirty (30) days after notice is issued

V. CONCLUSION

For the reasons discussed above, Staff recommends that the application be found administratively complete, that Quadvest be directed to provide notice as detailed above and in the attached memorandum, and that the proposed procedural schedule be adopted.

On February 7, 2018, Quadvest, L.P. (Quadvest or Applicant) filed an application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) to amend water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 11612 and sewer CCN No. 20952 in Fort Bend County pursuant to Tex. Water Code Ann. (TWC) §§ 13.242 to 13.250 and 16 Tex. Admin. Code (TAC) §§ 24.101 to 24.107.

Based on Staff's review of the additional information filed by Applicant on April 9, 2018, Staff recommends that the application be deemed sufficient for filing and found administratively complete. Staff further recommends the following:

- 1) Provide notice of the application to the following:
 - a) cities, districts, and neighboring retail public utilities providing the same utility service whose corporate boundaries or certificated service area are located within two miles from the outer boundary of the requested area;
 - b) the county judge of each county that is wholly or partially included in the requested area;
 - c) each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partially included in the requested area;
 - d) landowners who own a tract of land that is at least 25 acres and is wholly or partly located in the requested area to be certified. The landowner information may be obtained from the county appraisal district tax rolls for the county or counties in which the requested area is located;
 - e) affected customers; and
 - f) publish notice once each week for two (2) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Fort Bend County.
- 2) Provide correct notice of the application to the following entities:
 - Village of Fairchilds
 - Brazos River Authority
 - Fort Bend County Drainage District
 - Fort Bend Subsidence District
 - Fort Bend County Judge
- 3) Provide an accurate map delineating the requested service area with each individual notice to neighboring utilities, other affected parties, landowners, and customers. Information related to districts including addresses can be obtained by the Applicant from the TCEQ web site located at http://www14.tceq.texas.gov/iwud/.

4) Within thirty (30) days of the date of the notice, file in the docket a map and copy of notice including an affidavit specifying every person and entity to whom notice was provided, the date that the notice was provided, and the publisher's affidavit for proof of newspaper publication. It is recommended that the Applicant use the attached notices and affidavits to meet these requirements.

Quadvest L.P. has filed an application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas to amend its Certificate of Convenience and Necessity for CCN No. 11612 and for CCN No. 20952 for the provision of retail water and sewer utility services in Fort Bend County.

The requested area is located approximately <u>8.5 miles southeast of downtown Rosenberg</u>, Texas, and is generally bounded on the north by <u>Fairchilds Creek</u>; on the east by <u>Boothline Road</u>; on the south by <u>Vacek Road</u>; and on the west by <u>Leroy Road</u>. The total requested area includes approximately <u>109</u> acres and <u>0</u> current customers.

The requested area overlaps the boundaries of the Fort Bend Subsidence District. If Fort Bend Subsidence District does not request a public hearing, the Commission shall determine that the district is consenting to the Quadvest L.P.'s request to provide retail water and sewer utility services in the requested area. The deadline for intervention in the proceeding is thirty (30) days from the mailing or publication of notice, whichever occurs later, unless otherwise provided by the presiding officer. You must send a letter requesting intervention to the commission which is received by that date.

If a valid public hearing is requested, the Commission will forward the application to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH) for a hearing. If no settlement is reached and an evidentiary hearing is held, SOAH will submit a recommendation to the Commission for final decision. An evidentiary hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.

A landowner with a tract of land at least twenty-five (25) acres or more, that is partially or wholly located within the requested area, may file a written request with the Commission to be excluded from the requested area ("opt out") within thirty (30) days from the date that notice was provided by the Utility. All opt out requests must include a large scale map and a metes and bounds description of the landowner's tract of land.

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
