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APPLICATION OF BOLIVER UTILITY SERVICES, LLC AND UNDINE TEXAS ENVIRONMENTAL, LLC FOR SALE, TRANSFER, OR MERGER OF FACILITIES AND CERTIFICATES RIGHTS IN GALVESTON COUNTY

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COMMISSION STAFF'S SUPPLEMENTAL RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS AND PROPOSED NOTICE

COMES NOW the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and in response to Order No. 2, files this Supplemental Recommendation on Administrative Completeness and Proposed Notice. Staff recommends that the application be deemed sufficient for further review. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

I. BACKGROUND

On March 8, 2018, Bolivar Utility Services, LLC (Bolivar) and Undine Texas Environmental, LLC (Undine) (collectively Applicants), filed an application for a sale, transfer, or merger of facilities and Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) rights in Galveston County, Texas. Specifically, Bolivar seeks to sell its sewer system and transfer the service area under CCN No. 21026 to Undine. The total area being requested includes approximately 37,468 acres and serves 668 current customers.

On April 11, 2018, Order No. 2 was issued, wherein the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) found the application deficient and established a deadline of May 9, 2018, for the Applicants to file a supplement to cure the deficiencies. On April 18, 2018, Undine filed a supplement to the application.

Order No. 2 also directed Staff to file a supplemental recommendation on the administrative completeness of the application and to propose a procedural schedule for further processing of the application by May 30, 2018. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

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II. ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

As detailed in the attached memorandum of Sean Scaff in the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division, Staff has reviewed the application and recommends that it be found administratively complete and accepted for filing.

III. NOTICE

As detailed in the attached memorandum, Staff recommends that Undine proceed with providing public notice and be directed to use the attached forms to provide such notice to the following persons, political subdivisions and other entities:

- a) cities, districts, and neighboring retail public utilities providing the same utility service whose corporate boundaries or certificated service area are located within two miles from the outer boundary of the requested area;
- b) the county judge of each county that is wholly or partially included in the requested area;
- c) each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partially included in the requested area; and

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d) affected customers.

In addition, Staff recommends that Undine provide correct notice of the application to the

following entities:

- Cade Ranch WCID 1
- Chambers County Judge
- City of Galveston (CCN No. 20519)
- City of Texas City (CCN No. 20050)
- Galveston County Judge

- Sabine Pass Port Authority
- Southeast Texas Agricultural Development District
- Trinity Bay Conservation District
- Trinity River Authority of Texas

Along with each individual notice, Staff recommends that Undine provide an accurate map delineating the requested service area. Additionally, Staff recommends that Undine file in the docket an affidavit specifying every person and entity to whom notice was provided and the date that such notice was provided within thirty (30) days of the date of the notice. It is recommended that Undine use the attached notice and affidavit to meet these requirements.

IV. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Staff proposes the following procedural schedule:

Deadline for Undine to file with the Commission a signed affidavit that notice was given along with a copy of the notice sent to the affected parties	June 29, 2018
Deadline for Staff to file a recommendation on sufficiency of notice and propose additional procedural schedule	Within ten (10) days of Undine filing proof of completed notice with the Commission
Deadline to intervene	Thirty (30) days after notice is issued

V. CONCLUSION

For the reasons discussed above, Staff recommends that the application be found administratively complete, that Undine be directed to provide notice as detailed above and in the attached memorandum, and that the proposed procedural schedule be adopted. Dated: May 30, 2018

On March 8, 2018, Undine Texas Environmental, LLC (Undine or Buyer) and Bolivar Utility Services, LLC (Bolivar or Seller) (collectively, Applicants) filed an application for Sale, Transfer, or Merger (STM) of facilities and certificate rights in Galveston County, Texas, pursuant to Texas Water Code Ann. (TWC) § 13.301 and the 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.109. Specifically, Undine seeks approval to acquire facilities and to transfer all the service area under Bolivar's sewer Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 21026. The requested area includes approximately 37,468 acres and 668 connections.

Based on Staff's review of the additional information filed by Undine on April 18, 2018, Staff recommends that the application and mapping information be deemed sufficient for filing and be found administratively complete. Staff also recommends the following actions be required of Undine:

- 1) Provide notice of the application to the following:
 - a) cities, districts, and neighboring retail public utilities providing the same utility service whose corporate boundaries or certificated service area are located within two miles from the outer boundary of the requested area;
 - b) the county judge of each county that is wholly or partially included in the requested area;
 - c) each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partially included in the requested area; and
 - d) affected customers.
- 2) Provide correct notice of the application to the following entities:

 - Chambers County Judge

The total requested area for the water or sewer CCN(s) being transferred includes approximately <u>37,468</u> acres and <u>668</u> current customers.

This transaction will have the following effect on the current customers' rates and services: <u>This</u> transaction will not affect the current customer's rates and services.

Hearing- and speech-impaired individuals with text telephones (TTY) may contact the commission at (512) 936-7136. The deadline for intervention in the proceeding is 30 days from the mailing or publication of notice, whichever occurs later, unless otherwise provided by the presiding officer. You must send a letter requesting intervention to the commission which is received by that date.

If a valid public hearing is requested, the Commission will forward the application to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH) for a hearing. If no settlement is reached and an evidentiary hearing is held, SOAH will submit a recommendation to the Commission for final decision. An evidentiary hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.
