RE: Docket No. 48250 – *Application to Amend Certificates of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) - Stanley Lake MUD, SC Utilities and T&W Water Service*

To Whom It May Concern:

On April 10, 2018, Stanley Lake Municipal Utility District ("The MUD" or "Applicant") filed an application with the Commission for approval to transfer a certain section of property from one CCN to another for water and sewer services. The previous CCN providers refused to extend services to these property owners due to the limited capacity of their respective systems. The project has been in process for over two years including negotiations between the two Investor Owned Utilities, Mr. Feng (the impacted property owner) and The MUD. While it was not specifically stated in the Application, the purpose of the transaction was to allow Mr. Feng to convert from well and septic to city services which are already available from the District in the area. Mr. Feng has received TCEQ violation notices for his septic system, which is exacerbated by his proximity to Lake Conroe, and the fact that he operates a dry cleaner facility at that location.

The PUC Motion to Admit Evidence was filed in the Docket on November 9, 2018. The Docket was not ruled Complete by the Administrative Law Judge until January 3, 2019. The District has not received the signed adjudication documents, making 4 months since the Docket package was filed uncontested with a recommendation for approval. Failure to close the Docket leaves Mr. Feng in a position that might include additional TCEQ violations. He has been planning to cease major maintenance and upgrades of his septic system for the past two years.

Stanley Lake MUD respectfully requests that this docket be expedited for signature to allow the service connections to be completed, thereby preventing potential environmental violations from the old septic system, or creating further burden to Mr. Feng to make short term upgrades. The PUC process has been completed since November, and all that remains is the final signature for this uncontested transition. Please call my cell phone for immediate answers at (936) 718-5663.
