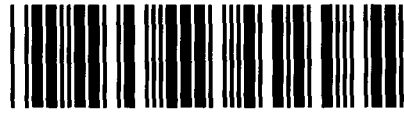

**COMMISSION STAFF’S RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE
COMPLETENESS AND PROPOSED NOTICE**

COMES NOW the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and in response to Order No. 1, files this Recommendation on Administrative Completeness and Proposed Notice. Staff recommends that the Application be deemed insufficient for further review. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

I. BACKGROUND

On April 19, 2018, Levi Water Supply Corporation (Levi WSC) filed an application to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 10018 in McLennan and Falls Counties, Texas.

On April 23, 2018, Order No. 1 was issued, establishing a deadline of May 18, 2018 for Staff to file comments on the administrative completeness of the application and proposed notice and propose a procedural schedule. This pleading is therefore timely filed.

II. ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

As detailed in the attached memorandum from Gregory Charles in the Commission’s Water Utility Regulation Division, Staff has reviewed the application and recommends that it be found administratively incomplete. Specifically, Staff has identified deficiencies in the mapping information submitted. Staff recommends that Levi WSC submit additional mapping information, as further detailed in the attached memorandum.

III. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Staff recommends that the application be found administratively incomplete. Staff therefore recommends that a deadline of June 18, 2018, be established for Levi WSC to supplement

its application. Staff further recommends that a deadline of July 18, 2018, be established for Staff to review Levi WSC's supplemental information and make a supplemental recommendation on the administrative completeness of the application.

IV. CONCLUSION

For the reasons discussed above, Staff recommends that the application be found administratively incomplete. Staff further recommends that the procedural schedule proposed above be adopted for further processing of this docket.



Subject: **Docket No. 48299:** *Application of Levi Water Supply Corporation to Amend a Water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity in McLennan and Falls Counties.*

On April 23, 2018, Levi Water Supply Corporation (Levi WSC or Applicant) filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) an application to amend water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 10018 in McLennan and Falls Counties pursuant to Texas Water Code Ann. (TWC) §§ 13.242 to 13.250 and the 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §§ 24.101 to 24.107.

Staff has reviewed the information provided by the Applicant and recommends the application be deemed administratively incomplete and not accepted for filing due to the deficiencies detailed below:

Mapping information:

The hard copy map submitted, labeled as Exhibit 3B in the application, shows a different area than the area included in the digital data. The following requested areas are shown in Exhibit 3B but are not represented in the digital data: Berry Drive, Kraemer Pass, Bullhide Creek Road, Augusta Lane, and County Road 430. The Applicant must submit the following items to resolve the mapping deficiencies. The Applicant should note that all mapping materials must show the same requested area:

- A detailed map identifying only the requested area, in reference to verifiable man-made and natural landmarks, such as roads, rivers, and railroads; and
- Digital mapping data for the requested area, as a single polygon record, in shapefile (SHP) format, georeferenced in either NAD83 Texas Statewide Mapping System (Meters) or NAD83 Texas State Plane Coordinate System (US Feet); **OR** metes and bounds survey sealed or embossed by either a licensed state surveyor or a registered professional land surveyor.
