Notice of Pass-Through Rate Change pursuant to 16 Tex. Admin. Code

§ 24.21(b)(2)(E)

Undine, acting as Temporary Manager of Suburban, files this Notice of Pass-Through Rate Increase pursuant to 16 Tex. Admin. Code (TAC) § 24.21(b)(2)(E) for the Cypress Bend Subdivision only.

Undine was appointed Temporary Manager of Suburban on September 23, 2017 and again on March 21, 2018. The water utility services for the Cypress Bend Subdivision in Harris County, Texas (PWS # 1010119) are provided through groundwater. This subdivision is within the boundaries of the North Harris County Regional Water Authority (Authority) and is subject to the Authority's rules and regulations.

At the meeting of the Authority's Board of Directors on December 4, 2017, the Authority took formal action to increase its well pumpage fee from \$2.90 per 1,000 gallons to \$3.40 per 1,000 gallons pumped from each non-exempt well subject to the Authority's jurisdiction, effective April 1, 2018, with a payment due date of June 18, 2018.

Undine therefore requests to amend its tariff to allow for recovery of the increased well pumpage fee and to recover water losses at the level of 35.6%, for a total pass-through amount of \$5.28 per 1,000 gallons used by its customers in the Cypress Bend Subdivision, or an increase of \$1.87/1,000 when taking into account its water line loss factor. Undine will mail a Customer Notice of this Pass-Through Rate Change to all of its customers as required by 16 TAC § 24.21(b)(2)(E)(ii) on or about April 20, 2018, such change to take effect on April 1, 2018, to be reflected at the start of the next billing period, on or about April 21, 2018.

Undine is in the process of acquiring Suburban. If the acquisition occurs, Undine intends to execute a Capital Expenditure Improvement plan and implement operational efficiencies. Some of the water loss is due to leaks within the system. When these improvements are completed, the water loss experienced to-date may decrease over time. As the water loss decreases, so should the adjusted rate for water loss.

- 5. Copy of the pages of the tariff that contain the rates that will change if the utility's application is approved attached as Exhibit E.

Be advised that North Harris County Regional Water Authority's (Authority) water pumpage fee has changed.

On December 4, 2017, the Authority's Board of Directors adopted an increase of the well pumpage fee to become effective April 1, 2018. The previous well pumpage fee was \$2.90/1,000 gallons.

The North Harris County Regional Water Authority Well Pumpage Fee to be charged to the Utility going forward is \$3.40/1,000 gallons. The Utility is allowed to adjust this fee for water losses. When this fee is adjusted it results in a charge of \$5.28/1,000 gallons.

Undine is in the process of acquiring Suburban Utility Company. If the acquisition occurs, Undine intends to execute a Capital Expenditure Improvement plan and implement Operational efficiencies. Some of the water loss is due to leaks within the system. When these improvements are completed, the water loss may decrease over time. As the water loss decreases, so should the adjusted rate for water loss.

This change by the Authority requires Undine to provide you NOTICE under Chapter 16 Texas Administrative Code § 24.21(b)(2)(E)(ii) of a TARIFF RATE REVISION as follows:

This tariff change is being implemented in accordance with the minor tariff changes allowed by 16 Texas Administrative Code § 24.21. The cost to you as a result of this change will not exceed the costs charged to your utility and will be paid directly to the North Harris County Regional Water Authority.

North Harris County Regional Water Authority Rate Order and Updated Pricing Policy

Dear Owner's Representative:

Please consider this letter as a reminder of actions that were taken by the North-Harris County Regional Water Authority (the "Allthority") Board of Directors (the "Board") at its regular monthly Board meeting held on December 4, 2017. The Authority Board conducted a Budget Workshop on November 20, 2017, and a Public Hearing on December 4, 2017 to review and discuss the possibility of increasing the Authority's well pumpage fee and the cost of surface water. At its regular meeting on December 4th, the Board adopted an increase of the current well pumpage fee from \$2,90 per 1,000 gallons to \$3,40 per 1,000 gallons and an increase in the cost of surface water from \$3.35 per 1,000 gallons to \$3.85 per 1,000 gallons. These new rates will become effective as of April 1, 2018 with the payment due date of June 18, 2018.

Factors that impacted this decision include:

The Harris-Galveston Subsidence District completed an applate of the 1999 Regulatory Plan and adopted a 2013 Regulatory Plan. A major requirement of that plan is that the Authority achieve a 60% use of surface water by 2025 as compared to the current 30% requirement. In order to reach that 60% mandate, the Authority will have to deliver surface water to a significant number of additional utility districts which will require construction of a greatly expanded water transmission and distribution system.

In addition, the Authority will be required to participate in the cost of the City's expansion of the Northeast Water Puffication Plant as well as construction of a second transmission line from the plant and will also have to pay the Authority's propata share of the cost of constructing the Luce Bayou Interbasin Transfer

UPDATED PRICING POLICY OF THE NORTH HARRIS COUNTY REGIONAL WATER AUTHORITY (Reflective April 1, 2018)

This Updated Pricing Policy of the North Harris County Regional Water Authority (this "Updated Pricing Policy") is intended to define the Cost of Water paid to the Authority for Water used within the Authority and is an integral part of the Authority's Rate Order (the "Rate Order"), adopted on October 5, 2009. Unless specifically defined otherwise, capitalized terms in this Updated Pricing Policy shall have the meanings defined in the Rate Order.

Riffective April 1, 2018, the following Cost of Water will apply to and be due by users of Water within the Authority:

Authority Water \$3.85 per 1,000 gailons Water pumped from a Non-Exempt Well \$3.40 per 1,000 gailons Imported Water \$3.40 per 1,000 gailons

In addition to the above Fees, the Authority shall continue to provide a credit to each Converted Entity that constructed a Chloramine System prior to December 1, 2015 in accordance with the Authority's prior policy and procedures. Such credits shall be calculated as outlined below. Furthermore, any credits for capital contributions paid to the Authority by a Payor shall continue as provided in the applicable written agreement executed between the Payor and the Authority.

The Authority may revise the above Pees and modify, delete or add any credit(s), subject to the provisions of any applicable written agreements, if and when necessary. Payors will be notified of any such changes.

Chloramination Credits

The annual Chloramination Credit shall be calculated by amortizing the cost of the Chloramine System at 6% interest over a 30-year period, which shall begin the year the facilities are placed in service. The annual Chloramination Credit amount will be divided by 12 and the resultant amount will be credited monthly toward the fees payable to the Authority for the Water used by the Converted Entity.

New/Replacement Facilities

In order to help facilitate the effective implementation of the GRP, any Payor who anticipates the construction of new or replacement Water production, storage and/or treatment facilities and/or related appurtenances shall advise the Authority of those plans as early in the process as possible. The Authority will review such proposed improvements for conformity with the goals of the GRP and the possibility of the Authority being able to address those needs (i.e., by providing water in lieu of the Payor having to construct or replace facilities). Within the limits of its jurisdiction, the Authority will regulate construction of such facilities to accomplish the goals of the GRP.

Policy Implementation

The General Manager is authorized to take any actions on behalf of the Authority necessary and convenient to accomplish the purposes of this Updated Pricing Policy. The General Manager is also authorized to take actions necessary to comply with any special credit provisions provided under any agreements that may exist between a Payor and the Authority.

Using 35.6% Water Losses

Cypress Bend had actual water losses of 35.6% for 2017. The formula for grossing-up the pass-through to

recover water losses no longer has an upper limit.

Therefore, the formula for grossing-up the North Harris County Regional Water Authority pumpage charge of \$3.40 for the actual water losses is as follows: \$3.40/(1-0.356) = \$5.28/1,000 gallons.

Undine Texas became the Temporary Manager of Suburban on September 23, 2017. However, pumpage and sales data for all of 2017 is used in this calculation.
