### AFFIDAVIT OF SUPPLEMENTAL NOTICE REGARDING NONCONFORMING OPT-OUT REQUESTS

COMES NOW, the City of Dayton (the "City"), and files this Affidavit of Supplemental Notice Regarding Nonconforming Opt-Out Requests ("Affidavit") in the above-referenced Docket.

#### I. BACKGROUND

On May 8, 2018, the City filed an application ("Application") with the Public Utility Commission of Texas ("Commission") to obtain water and sewer Certificates of Convenience and Necessity ("CCNs") in Liberty and Harris Counties. On June 18, 2018, the City mailed notice of the Application to neighboring systems, landowners, customers, and cities—many of whom filed requests to exclude property from the CCN service areas sought under the Application (each, an "Opt-Out Request"). On August 13, 2018, the Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") issued Order No. 3, deeming such notice sufficient.

To address the Opt-Out Requests, the City modified the area requested in its Application, submitting revised maps and digital data to the Commission on October 19, 2018. On November 27, 2018, the ALJ issued Order No. 6, which adopted Commission Staff's recommendation that the revised mapping information be deemed deficient and established an opportunity for the City to cure the issues identified by Staff. The City again submitted revised maps and digital data to the Commission on December 20, 2018. On February 5, 2019, in accordance with Staff's

recommendation, the ALJ issued Order No. 9, finding the supplemental mapping information sufficient.

Since that time, however, Staff has requested that the City provide additional mapping information related to Opt-Out Requests received by the City that do not meet the requirements of Texas Water Code § 13.246(h) or 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 24.227(h) (each, a "Nonconforming Opt-Out Request"). The City has been working in good faith to accommodate Staff's request, most recently proposing the Agreed Motion to Adopt a Procedural Schedule filed on March 19, 2020. That Procedural Schedule requires the City to file proof of providing additional notice to landowners who submitted Nonconforming Opt-Out Requests on or before March 25, 2010. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

#### II. VERIFICATION OF SUPPLEMENTAL NOTICE

On March 24, 2020, the City mailed additional notice of the Application, including an "Opt-Out Request Supplement/Confirmation Form," to landowners who submitted Nonconforming Opt-Out Requests. With this filing, as <a href="Exhibit 1">Exhibit 1</a>, the City submits an Affidavit of Supplemental Notice Regarding Nonconforming Opt-Out Requests, as well as a copy of the actual notice mailed to such landowners. More specifically, <a href="Exhibit 1">Exhibit 1</a> includes the following documentation:

- Affidavit of Supplemental Notice Regarding Nonconforming Opt-Out Requests,
- Attachment A List of Landowners Receiving Supplemental Notice, and
- Attachment B Copies of Supplemental Notice Provided.

#### IV. PRAYER

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, the City respectfully requests that the ALJ accept this Affidavit and grant all other relief to which the City is entitled.



Your request to opt-out of the proposed water and wastewater service area contemplated by the "Application of the City of Dayton for Certificates of Convenience and Necessity (each, a "CCN") in Liberty and Harris Counties" filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas ("PUC") in Docket No. 48350

Dear Mr. Stoesser:

You previously provided written notice of your election to exclude some or all of your property from the water and wastewater CCN service areas proposed by the above-referenced application (your "Opt-Out Request"). However, your Opt-Out Request does not meet the statutory and regulatory requirements set forth for such requests in Texas Water Code § 13.246(h) and Title 16 Texas Administrative Code § 24.227(h) (collectively, the "Rules").

Pursuant to the Rules, an eligible landowner's opt-out request must include: (A) the PUC Docket number and CCN number, if available; (B) the total acreage of the property subject to the landowner's opt-out request; and (C) for all such property, a metes and bounds survey, sealed or embossed by a licensed state land surveyor or registered professional land surveyor, of the precise acreage to be excluded from the requested area.

At this time, your Opt-Out Request lacks the information necessary for the City of Dayton ("City") to determine the acreage/location of your property to be excluded from its proposed CCN service areas. More specifically, the City cannot properly address your Opt-Out Request because: (1) there is a significant discrepancy between the acreage you requested that the City exclude and the acreage represented in the documents provided; and (2) documentation supporting your Opt-Out Request was missing, incomplete and/or unclear.

The map included with your Opt-Out Request depicts multiple tracts of land, labeled 1-4, to be excluded from the City's proposed CCN service areas. Please submit a complete, sealed metes and bounds description of each tract of land subject to your Opt-Out Request, and indicate which of such metes and bounds descriptions corresponds with the tracts designated for exclusion on the map provided with your Opt-Out Request.
