**ORDER NO. 2
FINDING APPLICATION ADMINISTRATIVELY INCOMPLETE;
AND ESTABLISHING AN OPPORTUNITY TO CURE**

This Order addresses Commission Staff's July 2, 2018, recommendation that the administrative law judge (ALJ) deem the application of Green Valley Special Utility District and the City of Schertz (collectively, applicants) for a sale, transfer or merger of facilities and certificate rights administratively incomplete. The memorandum of Debbie Reyes of the Commission's Water Utility Regulation division specifically describes the material deficiencies in the application.


The ALJ finds the application incomplete and deficient. Under Title 16 of the Texas Administrative Code § 24.8(d), the Commission does not consider applications filed until it has made a determination of administrative completeness; thus, at this time the application is not considered filed with the Commission.

On or before July 31, 2018, applicants shall supplement the application to cure the deficiencies described by Commission Staff. Until the Commission receives and reviews the supplemental information, the application cannot proceed. Applicants shall not issue notice until the application is administratively complete.

On or before August 28, 2018, Commission Staff shall file a supplemental recommendation regarding administrative completeness, along with a proposed procedural schedule, if appropriate.
