ORDER NO. 1 REQUIRING COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION

I. Application

This Order addresses the June 8, 2018 application of Patton Village Water Company and the City of Patton Village, for sale, transfer, or merger of facilities and certificate rights in Montgomery County. If approved, Patton Village Water Company's facilities and water service area under certificate of convenience and necessity number 11193 will transfer to the City of Patton. The transfer includes approximately 500 acres and 550 current customers.

II. Establishing Deadline for Commission Staff's Recommendation

Commission Staff shall file on or before July 9, 2018, a recommendation regarding administrative completeness of this application, whether additional notice may be required to comply with the applicable rules, and propose a schedule for processing.

The Commission will submit notice of this application for publication in the *Texas* Register.

III. Filings

Unless otherwise specified, an original and ten copies of documents relating to this proceeding must be filed with the Commission filing clerk.² A copy of each document filed with the Commission must also be served on all parties.³ Filings can be accessed on the PUC Interchange, http://interchange.puc.texas.gov.

All parties shall provide their current addresses, telephone and fax numbers, if available, to all other parties and the Commission by filing and serving all parties with such information. Each party shall provide the Commission and all parties with updated address, telephone, and fax information if such information changes. The telephone and fax numbers will be placed on the service list for this proceeding. Parties are responsible for updating their own service lists to reflect changed information and the addition of any other parties.

IV. Ex Parte Communications

Ex parte communications with the administrative law judges and presiding officer (collectively, ALJs) are prohibited.⁴ Parties shall communicate with the ALJs only through written documents filed with the Commission's filing clerk and served on all parties. Questions concerning this order or any other order must be submitted in writing, filed with the Commission, and served on all parties of record.
