COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS AND PROPOSED NOTICE

COMES NOW the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and in response to Order No. 1, files this Recommendation on Administrative Completeness and Proposed Notice. Staff recommends that the application be deemed deficient and that the applicant be ordered to address the identified deficiencies. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

I. BACKGROUND

On June 26, 2018, MSEC Enterprises, Inc. (MSEC) filed an application to amend water certificate of convenience and necessity number (CCN) 12887 in Montgomery County. MSEC is seeking to amend its application to provide water service requested by the landowner in an area with no current retail water utility service. The affected service area requested includes approximately 40 acres and 0 customers.

On June 29, 2018, the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) issued Order No. 1, establishing a deadline of July 26, 2018 for Staff to file a recommendation on the administrative completeness of the application, the sufficiency of the proposed notice, and to propose a procedural schedule. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

II. APPLICATION DEFICIENCY RECOMMENDATION

As detailed in the attached memorandum of Jolie Mathis in the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division, Staff has reviewed the application and respectfully recommends that the ALJ find it administratively incomplete at this time. Staff recommends that Applicant be ordered to cure the deficiencies identified in Ms. Mathis' memorandum by August 27, 2018, and that Staff be given a deadline of September 27, 2018, to file a supplemental recommendation on the administrative completeness of the application. Staff notes that Applicant should not issue notice until the application is found administratively complete.

III. COMMENTS ON PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

In accordance with Staff's deficiency recommendation, Staff does not propose a procedural schedule for further processing of this docket at this time. Staff intends to propose a procedural schedule alongside a subsequent recommendation for application sufficiency.

IV. CONCLUSION

For the reasons discussed above, Staff respectfully recommends that the application be found administratively incomplete at this time and that Applicant be ordered to file a supplement addressing the identified deficiencies in the application by August 27, 2018.

On June 26, 2018, MSEC Enterprises, Inc. filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) an application to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 12887 and sewer CCN No. Montgomery County, Texas pursuant to Texas Water Code Ann. (TWC) §§ 13.242 to 13.250 and the 16 Tex. Admin Code (TAC) §§ 24.101 to 24.107.

Staff has reviewed the information provided by the Applicant and recommends the application be deemed administratively incomplete and not accepted for filing due to the deficiencies detailed below:

Mapping Information

Maps submitted are deficient. Applicant must submit the following items to resolve the mapping deficiencies:

1. Digital mapping data for the requested area, as a single polygon record, in shapefile (SHP) format, georeferenced in either NAD83 Texas Statewide Mapping System (Meters) or NAD83 Texas State Plane Coordinate System (US Feet); **OR** metes and bounds survey sealed or embossed by either a licensed state surveyor or a registered professional land surveyor.
