COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

COMES NOW the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and files this Recommendation on Administrative Completeness in response to Order No. 1 and would show the following:

I. BACKGROUND

On August 3, 2018, Denton County Fresh Water Supply District No. 10 (the District) filed a petition for approval of an agreement with Mustang Special Utility District (Mustang SUD) under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.248 and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.117. As part of that agreement, a portion of certificated service area that is currently dually certificated to the District and Mustang SUD would be decertified from the District's water and sewer certificates of convenience and necessity (CCN) Nos. 13021 and 20923. On September 4, 2018, the District filed supplemental information.

On August 13, 2018, Order No. 1 was issued, establishing a deadline of September 4, 2018, for Staff to file a recommendation on the administrative completeness of the petition and proposed notice and propose a procedural schedule. This pleading is therefore timely filed.

II. ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

As detailed in the attached memorandum from Fred Bednarski in the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division, Staff has reviewed the petition and recommends that it be found administratively complete. Specifically, the Petition as supplemented on September 4 includes the information required by 16 TAC § 24.117(b), including complete maps and mapping data, a copy

of the executed agreement, the number of customers to be transferred, and the information necessary to evaluate the District's proposed notice under 16 TAC § 24.117(c).

III. NOTICE

Notice requirements for TWC § 13.248 applications are defined in 16 TAC § 24.117(c), which provides that the notice requirements of 16 TAC § 24.106 do not apply to TWC § 13.248 applications. Affected customers will be transferred as part of the agreement between the District and Mustang SUD. Therefore, consistent with 16 TAC § 24.117(c)(1) and as further detailed in the attached memorandum, Staff recommends that individual notice be provided to the affected customers using the attached notice. Consistent with 16 TAC § 24.117(c)(3), Staff further recommends that proof of notice be filed using the attached affidavit along with a representative copy of the notice provided.

IV. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Staff recommends that the petition be found administratively complete. Staff therefore proposes the following procedural schedule:

Deadline for Applicant to file proof of notice with the Commission	October 4, 2018
Deadline for Staff to file a recommendation on sufficiency of notice	Within 10 days of Applicant filing proof of completed notice with the Commission
Deadline to intervene	30 days after notice is issued

V. CONCLUSION

For the reasons discussed above, Staff recommends that the petition be deemed administratively complete, that notice be provided as detailed above, and that the proposed procedural schedule be adopted for further processing of this docket.

On August 3, 2018, Denton County Fresh Water Supply District No. 10 (Denton County FWSD 10) filed a petition with the Public Utility Commission of Texas to decertify a portion of its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 13021 and its sewer CCN No. 20923 in Denton County pursuant to Texas Water Code § 13.248. The area to be decertified is currently dually certificated, for water and sewer, with Mustang Special Utility District's (Mustang SUD) water CCN No. 11856 and sewer CCN No. 20930. If approved, Mustang SUD will be singly certificated in the requested area and will serve the existing customers. The total area includes approximately 849 acres and 2,452 current customers.

Staff has reviewed the application and mapping documentation filed on August 03, 2018, and supplemented on September 4, 2018, and recommends the application be deemed administratively complete and sufficient for filing. Staff further recommends the Applicant be ordered to do the following:

- 1) Provide correct notice of the application, with current rates, and the effective dates those rates were instituted, to all affected customers under 16 Texas Administrative Code § 24.117(c).
- 2) Include a copy of an accurate map delineating the requested area with each individual notice.
- 3) Within 30 days of the date of the notice, file in the docket a map and copy of notice along with an affidavit specifying every person and entity to whom notice was provided and the date that the notice was provided. It is recommended that the Applicants use the attached notice and affidavit to meet these requirements.

Denton County Fresh Water Supply District No. 10 (Denton County FWSD), water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 13021 and sewer CCN No. 20923. has submitted an application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas pursuant to Tex. Water Code § 13.248, for approval of a contract service agreement to decertify area dually certificated with Mustang Special Utility District's (Mustang SUD) water CCN No. 11856 and sewer CCN No. 20930. If approved, Mustang SUD will be singly certificated for service in the area and will serve the existing customers.

The requested area is located approximately <u>6</u> miles <u>west</u> of downtown <u>Prosper</u>, TX, and is generally bounded on the north by <u>Bryan Road</u>; on the east by <u>FM 1385</u>; on the south by <u>US Hwy 380 (E. University Drive)</u>; and on the west by <u>Trenton Drive</u>. The requested area includes approximately 849 total acres and 2,452 customers in Arrowbrooke and Savannah subdivisions.

This contract service agreement will have the following effect on the customers' rates and services: Customers will be charged the following rates. The Effective Date of these rates is January 19, 2017.

Monthly Rates for Residential Water Service – Monthly base rate \$24.50 plus for each 1,000 gallons of water actually used up to 5,000 gallons \$3.00 per 1,000 gallons; 5,001-10,000 gallons \$4.00 per 1,000 gallons; and over 10,000 gallons \$5.00 per 1,000 gallons.

Monthly Rates for Residential Sanitary Sewer Service – Monthly base rate \$43.50 for up to 5,000 gallons of water used; \$45.50 for water usage of 5,001-10,000 gallons of water used; and \$48.50 for water usage over 10,000 gallons of water used.

If a valid public hearing is requested, the Commission will forward the application to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH) for a hearing. If no settlement is reached and an evidentiary hearing is held, SOAH will submit a recommendation to the Commission for a final decision. An evidentiary hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.
