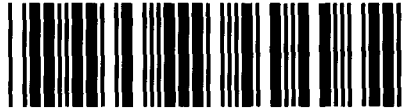

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**ORDER NO. 2
FINDING APPLICATION ADMINISTRATIVELY INCOMPLETE AND DEFICIENT;
AND ESTABLISHING AN OPPORTUNITY TO CURE**

This Order addresses Commission Staff's recommendation filed on September 27, 2018, on the administrative completeness of the application filed by the City of Marshall on August 28, 2018. Commission Staff recommends that the administrative law judge (ALJ) find the application deficient and provide the City of Marshall an opportunity to cure the deficiency described in the recommendation.

The ALJ finds the application incomplete and deficient. Under Texas Administrative Code § 24.8(d), the Commission does not consider an application filed until it makes a determination that the application is administratively complete. Thus, at this time the application is not considered filed with the Commission.


On or before October 29, 2018, the City of Marshall must supplement the application to cure the deficiency identified and described by Commission Staff. Until the Commission receives and reviews the supplemental information, the application cannot proceed. The City of Marshall must not issue notice until the application is administratively complete.

On or before November 29, 2018, Commission Staff must file a supplemental recommendation regarding the administrative completeness of the application, along with a proposed procedural schedule, if appropriate.
