

APPLICATION OF THE CITY OF LUCAS TO AMEND A WATER CERTIFICATE OF CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY IN COLLIN COUNTY



ORDER NO. 5 FINDING NOTICE SUFFICIENT AND ESTABLISHING A PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

This Order addresses the application of the City of Lucas to amend its water certificate of convenience and necessity in Collin County.

On March 6, 2019, the City of Lucas filed various revised affidavits attesting that notice was provided on December 20, 2019 to all affected parties within two miles of the affected service area, to the county judge of Collin County, and to each groundwater conservation district in which the requested service area is located. The City of Lucas included the affidavit of Nick Souders, inside sales manager, attesting that notice was published in the *Allen American* on December 20 and 27, 2018.

The ALJ finds notice sufficient and establishes the following procedural schedule:

Deadline for Commission Staff to provide final maps, certificates, and tariffs (if applicable) to the City of Lucas for review and consent	March 27, 2019
Deadline for the City of Lucas to file signed consent forms with the Commission	April 10, 2019
If no hearing is requested, deadline for Commission Staff to file a final recommendation on the application	April 17, 2019
If no hearing is requested, deadline for parties to file joint proposed findings of fact, including findings that address the factors in Texas Water Code § 13.246(c), and corresponding conclusions of law	April 24, 2019
